1. BEGIN SUMMARY. THE IRISH GOVERNMENT'S REACTION TO THE JULY 3 RELEASE OF BRITISH PARATROOPER LEE CLEGG HAS BEEN PREDICTABLY NEGATIVE. IRISH OFFICIALS ARE CONCERNED THAT CLEGG'S RELEASE WILL SET BACK THEIR EFFORTS TO CONVINCENATIONALISTS THAT THEY SHOULD HAVE FAITH IN THE ADMINISTRATION OF JUSTICE IN NORTHERN IRELAND. IF SINN FEIN'S STRONGLY NEGATIVE INITIAL REACTION IS ANY INDICATION, IRISH CONCERNS ABOUT THE IMPACT ON THE PEACE PROCESS MAY BE JUSTIFIED. THE HOPE IN DUBLIN IS THAT THE UK WILL LIMIT THE DAMAGE BY FINALLY AGREEING TO THE EARLY RELEASE OF SOME OF THE IRA PRISONERS HELD IN BRITAIN AND NORTHERN IRELAND. END SUMMARY.

THE TAOISEACH

2. IN RESPONSE TO THE RELEASE OF CLEGG, THE TAOISEACH OFFICE'S RELEASED A SHORT STATEMENT THAT JOHN BRUTON HAD "EXPRESSED HIS SYMPATHY FOR THE FAMILY OF KAREN REILLY ON THIS DAY WHEN THE AGONY OF THE LOSS OF THEIR DAUGHTER HAS BEEN BROUGHT HOME TO THEM ONCE AAIN." HE STATEMENT WENT ON TO NOTE THAT BRUTON AD TOLD UK PRIME MINISTER MAJOR "THAT ALL THOSE ONVICTED OF SERIOUS OFFENSES SHOUnD BE TREATED EUALLY BEFORE THE LAW AND BY EXECUTIVE ACTION." A A RESULT OF THE CLEGG RELEASE, "THE TAOISEACH NOW

EXPECTS THE BRITISH AUTHORITIES TO APPLY THE SAME APPROACH TO ALL OTHER SIMILAR PRISONER CASES, BOH LOYALIST AND REPUBLICAN."

DEPARTMENT OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS

3. A SPOKESMAN FOR DEPUTY PRIME MINISTER/FOREIGN MINISTER DICK SPRING SAID THE DECISION TO RELEASE CLEGG WITHOUT ANY ACCOMPANYING MOVEMENT ON IRA OR LOYALIST PRISONERS WAS UNFORTUNATE BECAUSE SPRING HAD MADE CLEAR THAT THE CLEGG CASE "SHOULD NOT BE DEALT WITH IN ISOLATION." THE SPOKESMAN SAID SPRING WOULD BE IN CONTACT WITH NORTHERN SECRETARY SIR PATRICK MAYHEW TO PURSUE THE MATTER FURTHER. THE IRISH VIEW WAS THAT IN ORDER TO CREATE CONFIDENCE IN THE ADMINISTRATION OF JUSTICE IN NORTHERN IRELAND, ALL PRISONERS INCARCERATED IN CONNECTION WITH THE "TROUBLES" HAD TO BE TREATED ON AN "EVEN-HANDED AND IMPARTIAL BASIS."

4. DAVID DONOGHUE, COUNSELLOR FOR POLITICAL AFFAIRS IN THE DEPARTMENT OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS' ANGLO-IRISH DIVISION, TOLD US THAT SPRING HAD SPECIFICALLY RAISED THE CLEGG CASE WITH MAYHEW AT THE JUNE 30 ANGLO-IRISH INTERGOVERNMENTAL CONFERENCE IN LONDON. SPRING HAD EMPHASIZED THAT THE IRISH GOVERNMENT WAS NOT TAKING A POSITION ON THE MERITS OF THE CASE, BUT INSTEAD, WAS CONCERNED ABOUT THE EFFECT THE EARLY RELEASE WOULD HAVE ON NATIONALISTS' PERCEPTIONS OF THE ADMINISTRATION OF JUSTICE IN NORTHERN IRELAND. FREEING CLEGG WITHOUT MAKING ANY MOVES ON REPUBLICAN OR LOYALIST PRISONERS WOULD SEND THE WRONG SIGNAL. IF THE BRITISH WERE GOING TO "LOOSEN THE RULES," THEY HAD DO IT "ACROSS THE BOARD." UNFORTUNATELY, SAID DONOGHUE, IT WAS CLEAR THAT MAYHEW HAD IGNORED SPRING'S ADVICE.

SINN FEIN

5. SINN FEIN'S HARSH INITIAL REACTION TO THE BRITISH DECISION SEEMS TO JUSTIFY DUBLIN'S CONCERNS. WARNING THAT THE CLEGG RELEASE COULD HAVE "PROFOUND IMPLICATIONS FOR THE PEACE PROCESS," PARTY CHAIRMAN MITCHEL MCLAUGHLIN SAID: "THIS IS A PURELY POLITICAL DECISION WHICH EXPOSES AS HYPOCRITICAL AND DUPLICITOUS BRITISH CLAIMS OF SO-CALLED DUE PROCESS OF LAW. IT STANDS IN STARK CONTRAST TO MAJOR'S REFUSAL TO MOVE ON THE ISSUE OF IRISH POLITICAL PRISONERS. ONCE AGAIN, WE SEE THAT THERE IS ONE LAW FOR MEMBERS OF THE BRITISH FORCES AND ONE FOR EVERYONE ELSE. THIS DECISION UNDERMINES CONFIDENCE, REMOVES TRUST AND WILL INCREASE THE WIDESPREAD UNEASE WHICH ALREADY SURROUNDS BRITAIN'S ATTITUDE TO THE PEACE PROCESS."

COMMENT

6. THE ANNOUNCEMENT OF CLEGG'S RELEASE CAME AS NO SURPRISE TO THE IRISH GOVERNMENT; IT HAD BEEN RUMORED FOR WEEKS (REFTEL). STILL, DUBLIN IS CLEARLY DISAPPOINTED THAT THE

BRITISH DECIDED TO GO FORWARD DESPITE STRONG IRISH ARGUMENTS AGAINST DOING SO. IRISH OFFICIALS ARE ALSO UNHAPPY THAT THEY RECEIVED PRACTICALLY NO PRIOR NOTICE. (DFA SECOND SECRETARY SEAN O'HUIGINN TOLD US THAT THE BRITISH ADVISED THEM OF THE DECISION ONLY 30 MINUTES BEFORE IT WAS PUBLICLY ANNOUNCED.) WITH THE PEACE PROCESS STALLED OVER ARMS DECOMMISSIONING, THE TIMING OF THIS RELEASE IS UNCLAS SECTION 02 OF 02 DUBLIN 003214

SUBJECT: IRISH GOVERNMENT JOINS SINN FEIN AND SDLP IN
CALLING FOR START OF ALL-PARTY TALKS

1. BEGIN SUMMARY. THE TAOISEACH AND FOREIGN MINISTER ON JULY 14 JOINED SINN FEIN PRESIDENT GERRY ADAMS AND SDLP LEADER JOHN HUME IN CALLING FOR THE START OF ALL-PARTY TALKS "AS SOON AS POSSIBLE." THE JOINT STATEMENT WAS CRITICIZED BY ALLIANCE PARTY LEADER JOHN ALDERDICE AS AN "UNHELPFUL POLITICAL STUNT" WHICH SEEMED AIMED TO CAUSE A "CRISIS." DEMOCRATIC LEFT LEADER PROINSIAS DE ROSSA, WHOSE PARTY IS A MEMBER OF THE "RAINBOW" GOVERNMENT, DID NOT PARTICIPATE IN THE MEETING WITH ADAMS AND HUME, INDICATING THAT HE HAS MISGIVINGS ABOUT HIS COALITION PARTNERS' EFFORT TO PRESENT A UNITED "NATIONALIST" FRONT WITH SINN FEIN.
END SUMMARY.

JOINT STATEMENT

2. FOLLOWING A PRIVATE MEETING ON THE MARGINS OF THE JULY 14 SESSION OF THE FORUM FOR PEACE AND RECONCILIATION IN DUBLIN, TAOISEACH JOHN BRUTON, FOREIGN MINISTER DICK SPRING, SDLP LEADER JOHN HUME, AND SINN FEIN PRESIDENT GERRY ADAMS ISSUED A JOINT STATEMENT CALLING FOR "INCLUSIVE ALL-PARTY TALKS" TO BEGIN "AS SOON AS POSSIBLE." THEY SAID THAT ALL-PARTY TALKS WERE NECESSARY TO OVERCOME THE "CURRENT IMPASSE IN THE PEACE PROCESS" AND TO ACHIEVE THEIR COMMON OBJECTIVE OF "AN EQUITABLE AND LASTING AGREEMENT THAT CAN COMMAND THE CONSENT AND ALLEGIANCE OF ALL." THE STATEMENT BEGAN WITH THE FOUR MEN REITERATING THEIR "TOTAL

AND ABSOLUTE COMMITMENT TO DEMOCRATIC AND PEACEFUL METHODS OF RESOLVING POLITICAL PROBLEMS."

ALLIANCE PARTY CRITICISM

3. THE STATEMENT WAS REPORTEDLY CRITICIZED BY ALLIANCE PARTY LEADER JOHN ALDERDICE, WHO DESCRIBED IT AS AN "UNHELPFUL POLITICAL STUNT." HE SAID THAT GOING FORWARD WITH ALL-PARTY TALKS AT A TIME WHEN THE UNIONISTS WERE CLEARLY NOT READY TO PARTICIPATE WAS AN ATTEMPT TO "CARVE THEM OUT OF THE PROCESS." ALDERDICE NOTED THAT "IT IS ALMOST AS THOUGH THERE WAS AN ATTEMPT TO CREATE A CRISIS."

DEMOCRATIC LEFT LEADER STAYS AWAY

4. NOTICEABLY ABSENT FROM THE GOVERNMENT SIDE IN THE PRIVATE MEETING WITH HUME AND ADAMS WAS PROINSIAS DE ROSSA OF DEMOCRATIC LEFT, WHO, AS LEADER OF THE SMALLEST COALITION PARTNER IN THE THREE-PARTY "RAINBOW" GOVERNMENT, MIGHT HAVE BEEN EXPECTED TO BE THERE. HIS ABSENCE RAISES THE POSSIBILITY OF A SPLIT WITHIN THE GOVERNMENT OVER NORTHERN IRELAND POLICY. IN HIS REMARKS TO THE FORUM, DE ROSSA ACCUSED THE IRA OF "SABRE-RATTLING" AND SAID THAT "VEILED THREATS OF A RESUMPTION OF VIOLENCE AND PLANTED STORIES IN NEWSPAPER OF INTENSIFIED TRAINING AND INTELLIGENCE OPERATIONS" COULD ONLY HURT THE PEACE PROCESS. BRUTON, SPEAKING AFTER ISSUANCE OF THE JOINT STATEMENT, SEEMED TO CONTRADICT THIS VIEW BY CLAIMING THAT "DOUBTS" ABOUT SINN FEIN'S FULL COMMITMENT TO THE PEACE PROCESS WERE "UNJUSTIFIED." A SPOKESMAN FOR DE ROSSA SAID LATER THAT THE DEMOCRATIC LEFT LEADER "FULLY SUPPORTS GOVERNMENT POLICY" BUT ACKNOWLEDGED THAT THERE WAS "A DIFFERENCE ON THE DEGREE OF PRESSURE WHICH SHOULD BE PUT ON SINN FEIN."

COMMENT

5. THE ANIMOSITY BETWEEN SINN FEIN AND DEMOCRATIC LEFT IS UNDERSTANDABLE GIVEN THEY ARE DESCENDED FROM THE TWO OPPOSING FACTIONS THAT EMERGED FROM THE 1970 SPLIT OF SINN FEIN AND THE IRA. THE JOINT STATEMENT WAS APPARENTLY THE INITIATIVE OF GERRY ADAMS, WHO WANTS TO SHOW THE BRITISH THAT SINN FEIN'S DEMANDS FOR ALL-PARTY TALKS AND THE EARLY RELEASE OF PRISONERS REFLECT A NATIONALIST "CONSENSUS."

2. REQUEST DEPARTMENT AUTHORIZATION FOR AMBASSADOR RAYMOND L. FLYNN TO TRAVEL TO IRELAND DURING THE PERIOD 10 AUGUST TO 23 AUGUST TO BE AN HONORED GUEST OF THE ANCIENT ORDER OF HIBERNIANS (A.O.H.) FROM THE UNITED STATES ON THEIR "FAMINE REMEMBRANCE TOUR."
3. ADDITIONALLY, AMBASSADOR FLYNN REQUESTS COUNTRY CLEARANCE FROM AMEMBASSY DUBLIN FOR THIS INVITATIONAL TRAVEL (REFTELCON).

INVITATIONAL TRAVEL

4. A WRITTEN REQUEST FROM THE OFFICE OF THE CHAIRMAN OF CHARITIES AND MISSIONS, A.O.H., INVITED AMBASSADOR FLYNN TO LEAD THE DELEGATION OF A.O.H. TO IRELAND THIS COMING AUGUST. THE CHAIRMAN CITED THE AMBASSADOR'S WORK ON BEHALF OF THE IRISH FAMINE ISSUE, THE AMBASSADOR'S LONG-STANDING COMMITMENT TO PEACE AND JUSTICE IN IRELAND, AND THE AMBASSADOR'S EARLY SUPPORT FOR PRESIDENT CLINTON WHEN HE HEADED UP THE IRISH AMERICANS FOR CLINTON COMMITTEE.

8. NO REASONABLE PERSON WOULD BELIEVE THAT BY PROVIDING HOTEL ACCOMMODATIONS/MEALS THE ORGANIZATION CONCERNED WAS OBTAINING IMPROPER INFLUENCE OVER THE POST OR THE DEPARTMENT.

9. THE ANCIENT ORDER OF HIBERNIANS HAS NO BUSINESS PENDING BEFORE THE DEPARTMENT.
