Dear President Clinton:

We are writing to urge you to appoint a Special Representative to Northern Ireland to facilitate discussions aimed at securing a peaceful resolution to the conflict.

We are particularly concerned about the recent increase in violence in Northern Ireland. In the last week of October alone, twenty-four people were killed as a result of political violence, making it the worst week of violence since the early 1980s. In light of the surge in violence, the parties involved, with the support of the United States, should redouble efforts to facilitate a peaceful resolution to the conflict. Appointing a Special Envoy would be an important and positive step in that process.

Despite the violence, we are encouraged that peace initiatives to find a long-term solution are being considered by the parties to the conflict in Northern Ireland. We believe the United States should play a more active role in facilitating discussions on these peace initiatives. Greater involvement by the United States through a Special Envoy could provide important momentum to advance the peace process.

We hope you will give serious consideration to appointing a Special Envoy so the United States can make a greater contribution to securing peace in Northern Ireland. We know you share our concern about promoting a peaceful resolution to the conflict in Northern Ireland and look forward to working with you on this issue.
