In light of the tragic bombing in London last week, I wanted to let you know that I intend to persevere in supporting the Northern Ireland peace process. In your most recent letter, you were kind enough to say that my visit to the UK, and in particular to Northern Ireland, had an emotional impact on the people and lifted their horizons. More than ever, I am convinced that our involvement in Northern Ireland is worthwhile and will be key to a lasting peace settlement.

We are going to do everything possible to get the cease-fire restored and the peace process back on track. There are difficult decisions ahead. As we face them, I will continue to value your wise counsel and advice.
