1. SENSITIVE BUT UNCLASSIFIED - PLEASE HANDLE ACCORDINGLY.

2. SUMMARY: DURING OUR PERIODIC MEETING WITH THE MFA NEW TRANSATLANTIC AGENDA (NTA) TEAM OCTOBER 29, THE AMBASSADOR AND EMBOFFS REVIEWED POSSIBLE "DELIVERABLES" FOR THE DECEMBER 5 U.S.-EU SUMMIT. TOPICS INCLUDED: IMPLEMENTATION OF THE APRIL 11 UNDERSTANDING ON HELMS-BURTON/ILSA SANCTIONS, DIPLOMATIC COOPERATION, GLOBAL ISSUES, ECONOMIC/COMMERCIAL ISSUES, AND PEOPLE-TO-PEOPLE PROGRAMS. THE GOL ASKED THAT THE SUMMIT AGENDA AND FORMAT BE FINALIZED AT THE SENIOR LEVEL GROUP (SLG) MEETING IN BRUSSELS NOVEMBER 20. END SUMMARY.

 APRIL 11 UNDERSTANDING

3. WE MET WITH THE MFA NTA TEAM (SECGEN MISCHO, ECONOMIC DIRECTOR SCHMIT, DEPUTY POLDIR WELFRING, DEPUTY 113 COMMITTEE REP FRIDEN, AND SECGEN ASSISTANT BAILLIE) TO DISCUSS U.S.-EU SUMMIT DELIVERABLES, LEADING OFF WITH THE APRIL 11 UNDERSTANDING.

4. SCHMIT NOTED THAT, IN HIS LATEST CONTACTS WITH EB A/S LARSEN, IT WAS CLEAR THAT THERE IS NO/NO IMMEDIATE DEADLINE FOR COMPLETING NEGOTIATIONS, BUT THAT THERE WOULD NEED TO BE SOME RESOLUTION BY NEXT SPRING. MISCHO SAID WE NEED TO PUT OUT A POSITIVE MESSAGE ON THIS ISSUE AT THE SUMMIT, TO THE EFFECT THAT NEGOTIATIONS ARE CONTINUING AND MOVING IN THE RIGHT DIRECTION.

DIPLOMATIC COOPERATION

5. MISCHO SAID UKRAINE COULD FIGURE IMPORTANTLY AT THE SUMMIT, PARTICULARLY IN REGARD TO CHERNOBYL-RELATED ASSISTANCE. HE NOTED THAT THE COMMISSION DG1A DIRECTOR GENERAL BURGHARDT WAS IN WASHINGTON DISCUSSING UKRAINE WITH THE USG. CONTINUING, MISCHO SAID HE HAD SEEN NO DRAFT OF A STATEMENT ON UKRAINE. THE SUMMIT SHOULD EXPRESS SATISFACTION THAT COOPERATION ON KEDO IS UNDERWAY AND SHOULD NOTE ONGOING COOPERATION ON ASSISTANCE TO THE FORMER YUGOSLAVIA. THE EU WOULD LIKE TO RAISE THE MIDDLE EAST PEACE PROCESS. HE SUGGESTED THAT PRESIDENT CLINTON COULD ASK PM JUNCKER FOR A READOUT OF HIS TRIP TO TURKEY IN LATE NOVEMBER. THE AMBASSADOR SUGGESTED THAT THE CYPRUS ISSUE MIGHT ALSO COME UP, ESPECIALLY SINCE TURKISH PRESIDENT YILMAZ WOULD BE VISITING WASHINGTON SHORTLY AFTER THE U.S.-EU SUMMIT.

GLOBAL ISSUES  
-----

6. MISCHO NOTED THAT THE K-4 COMMITTEE HAD GIVEN A GREEN LIGHT TO EXCHANGES BETWEEN EUROPOL AND U.S. LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES, AND EXPRESSED THE HOPE THAT THE FIRST VISIT COULD OCCUR BEFORE THE SUMMIT, TO LAUNCH THE PROGRAM. WE SAID WE UNDERSTOOD THAT JUSTICE MINISTER FISCHBACH WOULD DELIVER A LETTER ON THIS SUBJECT TO ATTORNEY GENERAL RENO DURING HIS NOVEMBER 3-4 VISIT TO WASHINGTON. WE REITERATED THAT WE WOULD APPRECIATE RECEIVING AN ADVANCE COPY OF THE LETTER.

7. MISCHO NOTED THAT THE KYOTO CONFERENCE ON CLIMATE CHANGE WOULD BE COMING RIGHT BEFORE THE U.S.-EU SUMMIT. HE HOPED A U.S.-EU "CLASH" COULD BE AVOIDED AT KYOTO. HE ALSO HOPED THE NOVEMBER 4 U.S.-EU TROIKA ENVIRONMENT MINISTERS' VISIT TO WASHINGTON WOULD HELP "DEFUSE" THE ISSUE. MISCHO COMMENTED THAT THE OCTOBER 23 EU PRESIDENCY DECLARATION ON THE U.S. AND JAPANESE PROPOSALS (REFTEL) HAD BROKEN NO NEW GROUND. THE AMBASSADOR PREDICTED THAT THE ISSUE WOULD GAIN INCREASING PROMINENCE IN COMING WEEKS AND URGED THE EU TO PRESENT NEW IDEAS. SCHMIT DID NOT THINK THE EU WAS READY TO CHANGE ITS POSITION; THE EUROPEANS WOULD BE TRYING TO CONVINCED THE U.S. TO MOVE FURTHER TOWARD THEM. MISCHO REPLIED THAT KYOTO SHOULD NOT BE PRESENTED AS SIMPLY A U.S.-EU ISSUE, BUT AS "BROADER." HE SUGGESTED THAT A SUMMIT STATEMENT SHOULD NOTE THAT WE SHARE THE SAME CONCERN OVER GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS, THAT SOMETHING SHOULD BE DONE, AND

THAT DEVELOPING COUNTRIES SHOULD BE INVOLVE (AT SOME STAGE). THE U.S. AND EU SHOULD WORK TOGETHER TO GET THE BEST POSSIBLE OUTCOME AT KYOTO.

8. MISCHO NOTED THAT THE TRAFFICKING IN WOMEN INITIATIVE WOULD START SOON AND A WORKSHOP WOULD BE HELD IN LUXEMBOURG NOVEMBER 21-22. THE U.S. SIDE SAID THAT PRM A/S-DESIGNATE TAFT TENTATIVELY PLANNED TO ATTEND (PENDING HER SENATE CONFIRMATION) AND THAT THE SUMMIT SHOULD HIGHLIGHT PROGRESS ON THE INITIATIVE.

ECONOMIC/COMMERCIAL ISSUES  
-----

9. WE EXPRESSED THE HOPE THAT WE WOULD SEE RESOLUTION OF SOME OF OUR TRADE CONCERNS (VETERINARY EQUIVALENCY, SPECIFIED RISK MATERIALS, BANANAS, BASIC TELECOMMUNICATIONS SERVICES, AND WINE) PRIOR TO THE SUMMIT. THE AMBASSADOR STATED THAT THESE ISSUES WERE OF GREAT CONCERN TO THE U.S. WE NOTED THAT SOME OF THESE ISSUES, FOR EXAMPLE ON SPECIFIC RISK MATERIALS, NEEDED TO BE RESOLVED QUICKLY. THE SUMMIT COULD EMPHASIZE CLOSURE ON SOME OF THE ISSUES AND CONTINUATION OF DISCUSSIONS ON OTHERS.

10. SCHMIT URGED THAT WE EMPHASIZE THE POSITIVE AT THE SUMMIT, HE NOTED THAT MANY OF THESE ISSUES WERE BEING DISCUSSED BETWEEN THE U.S. AND THE EUROPEAN COMMISSION, AND PROPOSED THAT THE SUMMIT SHOULD BALANCE CONFLICTUAL ISSUES-- INDICATING WE WOULD WORK HARD TO RESOLVE THEM--WITH COMMON INTERESTS, WHICH SHOULD BE HIGHLIGHTED. FOR EXAMPLE, WE SHOULD SEND A STRONG JOINT MESSAGE SUPPORTING COMPLETION OF A WTO FINANCIAL SERVICES AGREEMENT (WHICH IS EXPECTED SHORTLY AFTER THE SUMMIT), ISSUE A COMMON DECLARATION ON PRINCIPLES OF GLOBAL ELECTRONIC COMMERCE (THE COMMISSION WAS PREPARING A DRAFT), AND MOVE FORWARD ON A U.S.-PROPOSAL TO FOSTER SMALL AND MEDIUM-SIZED ENTERPRISES, INCLUDING CONTACTS, COOPERATION, AND EXCHANGE NETWORKS. U.S.-EU SEMINARS, TO BE HELD IN THE NEAR FUTURE ON COMBATTING ORGANIZED CRIME, TERRORISM, AND NARCOTICS TRAFFICKING, SHOULD BE NOTED IN THE SLG REPORT TO THE SUMMIT.

11. ON THE REGULATORY DIALOGUE, MISCHO SUGGESTED THE GOAL SHOULD BE TO ISSUE A JOINT STATEMENT AT THE SUMMIT. THE POSITIVE COMITY AGREEMENT, IT WAS NOTED, WAS NEARLY COMPLETE AND NEEDED ONLY TO BE VETTED BY THE EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT. THE LUXEMBOURGERS SAID THAT THE AGREEMENT "WAS APPROVED PENDING RATIFICATION BY THE EP." THE COMMISSION, HOWEVER, WAS MAKING LITTLE OR NO PROGRESS ON THE SWEATSHOP INITIATIVE. THE AMBASSADOR NOTED PRESIDENT CLINTON'S INTEREST IN THIS MATTER AND URGED THE PRESIDENCY TO PRESS THE COMMISSION FOR ACTION. THE GOL UNDERTOOK TO DO SO, BUT ASKED FOR SPECIFIC SUGGESTIONS FROM US.

12. MISCHO NOTED CONTACTS ON THE TRANSATLANTIC CONFERENCE INITIATIVES (INCLUDING A DEMONSTRATION OF THE TRANSATLANTIC INFORMATION EXCHANGE SERVICES--TIES) AND DIGITAL LIBRARY. THE LUXEMBOURGERS LOOKED FORWARD TO CONSULTING WITH THE U.S. SENIOR NTA COORDINATOR J.D. BINDENAGEL ON OCTOBER 30. REGARDING THE PLANNED ANNOUNCEMENT OF THE PANEL SELECTION FOR THE DEMOCRACY AND CIVIL SOCIETY AWARD, THE GOL ASKED WHO WOULD BE ON THE PANEL, AND THE AMBASSADOR SUGGESTED DISCUSSING THIS WITH BINDENAGEL. BOTH SIDES AGREED THAT THE SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY AGREEMENT WAS ON TRACK AND SHOULD BE SIGNED AT THE SUMMIT. ON THE TRANSATLANTIC BUSINESS DIALOGUE (TABD), SCHMIT SAID WE SHOULD LOOK TO THE RESULTS OF THE NOVEMBER 6-7 TABD MEETING IN ROME. THE AMBASSADOR URGED FAVORABLE MENTION AT THE SUMMIT OF THE ONGOING EXCHANGE PROGRAM, NOW IN ITS FOURTH SEMESTER, IN WHICH RECENT U.S. LAW SCHOOL GRADUATES SERVE AS INTERNS AT THE EUROPEAN COURT OF JUSTICE, AND NOTED THAT WE ARE WORKING TO ARRANGE A SIMILAR PROGRAM FOR EUROPEAN INTERNS IN THE U.S. HE INFORMED THE GOL OF A PLANNED VISIT BY U.S. SUPREME COURT JUSTICES TO THE ECJ AND OTHER EUROPEAN COURTS NEXT JULY.

SUMMIT AGENDA AND FORMAT  
-----

13. THE GOL PROPOSED THAT THE SUMMIT AGENDA NOT BE LIMITED TO NTA "DELIVERABLES," BUT INCLUDE POSSIBLE DISCUSSION OF IMPORTANT POLITICAL ISSUES SUCH AS EU ENLARGEMENT, ECONOMIC AND MONETARY UNION, AND THE RESULTS OF THE NOVEMBER 22 EU EMPLOYMENT SUMMIT. REGARDING THE EMPLOYMENT ISSUE, THE AMBASSADOR SUGGESTED A MEETING ON THE MARGINS OF THE SUMMIT BETWEEN PM JUNCKER AND LABOR SECRETARY HERMAN; MISCHO NOTED THAT THE PRESIDENCY DELEGATION WOULD BE ON A VERY TIGHT SCHEDULE IN WASHINGTON AND DEPART IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE

SUMMIT. THE AMBASSADOR BRIEFLY REVIEWED THE ESTABLISHED SUMMIT FORMAT (PRIVATE MEETING OF THE PRESIDENT, HEAD OF GOVERNMENT OF THE PRESIDENCY COUNTRY, AND PRESIDENT OF THE EUROPEAN COMMISSION; FOLLOWED BY A PLENARY SESSION; FINISHING WITH A LUNCHEON -- TOTAL TIME THREE HOURS). MISCHO ASKED WHETHER THE PRESS CONFERENCE WOULD TAKE PLACE AFTER THE PLENARY MEETING OR THE LUNCHEON. THE GOL REQUESTED THAT THE SUMMIT SCENARIO BE FINALIZED AT THE NOVEMBER 20 SLG MEETING IN BRUSSELS, INCLUDING DETAILS SUCH AS NUMBER OF CHAIRS IN THE PLENARY ROOM). THE GOL INDICATED THAT THE LUXEMBOURG DELEGATION WOULD ARRIVE LATE IN THE EVENING OF DECEMBER 4 AND THAT PM JUNCKER AND FM POOS WOULD DEPART DECEMBER 5 SHORTLY AFTER THE SUMMIT.

2. BINDENAGEL MET WITH MFA ECONDIR SCHMIT, DEPPOLDIR WELFRING, DEPUTY 113 COMMITTEE REP FRIDEN, AND SEC GEN MISCHO'S ASSISTANT BAILLIE. HE BRIEFED ON PROGRESS IN THE ELECTRONIC TRANS-ATLANTIC INFORMATION EXCHANGE (TIES); CIVIL SOCIETY DIALOGUE; EDUCATION, CULTURAL, AND YOUTH EXCHANGES; AND PARTNERSHIPS IN THE GLOBAL ECONOMY (INCLUDING THE TRANS-ATLANTIC BUSINESS DIALOGUE (TABD) AND TRANS-ATLANTIC LABOR DIALOGUE). HE ALSO ENUMERATED LIKELY AND POSSIBLE SUMMIT DELIVERABLES.

BINDENAGEL EMPHASIZED THE DESIRABILITY OF SIGNING A SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY AGREEMENT AT THE SUMMIT AND EXPRESSED THE HOPE THAT THE EUROPEAN COMMISSION WOULD GIVE A GREEN LIGHT FOR THE EU AND U.S. TO INITIAL THE AGREEMENT AT THE NOVEMBER 20 SENIOR LEVEL GROUP (SLG) IN BRUSSELS. BINDENAGEL WAS TRYING TO ORGANIZE A DINNER FOR SCIENTISTS AND INTERESTED POLITICIANS IN WASHINGTON THE DAY OF THE SUMMIT, TO COMMEMORATE THE SIGNING.

HE SAID STATEMENTS NEED TO BE PREPARED THAT EMPHASIZE HOW TIES CAN FACILITATE PEOPLE-TO-PEOPLE CONNECTIONS.

GIVEN THE PROBABLE DIFFICULTY OF OBTAINING FUNDING ON THE U.S. SIDE, THE PROPOSAL MIGHT BEST BE CAST AS A JOINT U.S.-EU EFFORT TO PROMOTE EXISTING EDUCATIONAL, ENVIRONMENTAL, AND DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS, TEACHER TRAINING FOR EXAMPLE.

THE LUXEMBOURG SIDE EXPRESSED PARTICULAR INTEREST IN THE CONFERENCE, BECAUSE OF THE CLOSE BUSINESS LINKS BETWEEN NORTHERN OHIO AND LUXEMBOURG (IMPORTANCE OF GOODYEAR TIRE MANUFACTURING IN BOTH PLACES; STEEL INDUSTRY AS THE HISTORIC ECONOMIC BASE).

THE IMPORTANCE OF THIS INITIATIVE FOR THE PRESIDENT AND IN U.S. PUBLIC OPINION AND THE IMPORTANCE OF ENGAGING BUSINESS IN THE DISCUSSION ON BOTH SIDES OF THE ATLANTIC. SCHMIT SAID THAT THERE HAS BEEN SOME ACTION ON THIS ISSUE BY RUG AND CARPET RETAILERS IN LUXEMBOURG AND ELSEWHERE IN EUROPE, WHICH NOW GUARANTEE CONSUMERS THAT THE PRODUCTS THEY ARE BUYING ARE NOT PRODUCED WITH CHILD LABOR. 1. (U) SUMMARY. DG V DEPUTY DIRECTOR GENERAL HYWEL JONES SAYS THAT THE SPANISH GOVERNMENT AND SPAIN'S "ONCE" FOUNDATION ARE WILLING JOINTLY TO HOLD A MEETING NEXT YEAR IN MADRID ON NEW TECHNOLOGIES AND EMPLOYMENT OF THE DISABLED. DG V NEEDS COMMITMENTS FROM U.S. FUNDING SOURCES TO COVER THE EXPENSES OF U.S. PARTICIPANTS. JONES WANTS TO SET UP A WORKING GROUP AND MEET WITH THE U.S. SIDE BEFORE THE END OF THE YEAR. DG V WILL BE READY IN THREE WEEKS TO ENGAGE WITH DOL ON THE FEBRUARY EUROPEAN SYMPOSIUM ON APPAREL INDUSTRY CODES OF CONDUCT AGREED TO BY SECRETARY HERMAN AND COMMISSIONER FLYNN AT THEIR OCTOBER 14 MEETING IN PARIS. FLYNN IS SEEKING ADVANCE COMMITMENTS FROM PARTICIPATING COMPANIES TO AN APPAREL-INDUSTRY-PARTNERSHIP-TYPE CODE. FLYNN WILL PROVIDE THE DECEMBER 4 HEALTH COUNCIL WITH A POLITICAL ASSESSMENT OF THE

STATUS OF THE NTA PUBLIC HEALTH INITIATIVE. DG V WANTS TO TRY AGAIN TO INITIATE COOPERATION WITH OSHA. JONES WILL SOON SEND DOL DEPUTY UNDERSECRETARY SAMET A PROPOSAL FOR THE WORKSHOP ON ORGANIZATION OF WORK TO BE HELD IN CONNECTION TO THE DOL/DG V WORKING GROUP MEETING NEXT JUNE. JONES SAYS IT IS STILL TOO EARLY TO PREDICT THE OUTCOME OF THE NOVEMBER EU JOBS SUMMIT, WHICH DEPENDS ON THE EXTENT TO WHICH CONCRETE OBJECTIVES ARE "WATERED DOWN." END SUMMARY.

2. (U) ON OCTOBER 30, THE DCM AND THE LABOR COUSELOR MET WITH HYWEL JONES, DEPUTY DIRECTOR GENERAL OF DG V, TO DISCUSS LABOR ITEMS ON THE NTA AGENDA. JONES' COMMENTS ON THE NTA LABOR DIALOGUE (TALKD= ARE BEING REPORTED SEPTEL. JONES WAS ACCOMPANIED BY FAY DEVONIC, HEAD OF DG V'S EXTERNAL RELATIONS OFFICE, AND HER ASSISTANT TROELS KROYER.

3. (U) JONES SAID THAT THE SPANISH GOVERNMENT AND SPAIN'S "ONCE" FOUNDATION, WHICH RUNS THE SPANISH LOTTERY AND REPORTEDLY HAS FUNDS EQUIVALENT TO ONE PERCENT OF SPAIN'S GDP, WERE WILLING JOINTLY TO HOST A BIG, QUALITY EVENT ON THE TOPIC OF NEW TECHNOLOGIES AND EMPLOYMENT OF THE DISABLED NEXT YEAR IN MADRID. SECRETARY OF LABOR HERMAN, JONES CONTINUED, HAD EXPRESSED HER SUPPORT FOR SUCH AN INITIATIVE AT HER OCTOBER 14 MEETING WITH EU COMMISSIONER PADRAIG FLYNN IN PARIS. THE COMMISSIONER "PASSIONATELY" SUPPORTED IT.

4. (U) WHAT WAS NEEDED, JONES STRESSED, WERE COMMITMENTS FROM DOL AND OTHER U.S. FUNDING SOURCES TO COVER THE EXPENSES OF U.S. PARTICIPANTS IN THE MADRID MEETING. DG V WOULD LIKE TO GET THESE COMMITMENTS BY EARLY DECEMBER SO AS TO BEGIN PLANNING THE MEETING, WHICH, IN JONES' OPINION, SHOULD TAKE PLACE BEFORE THE END OF SEPTEMBER, 1998. JONES WANTS TO SET UP A WORKING GROUP AND HAVE A JOINT MEETING WITH THE U.S. SIDE BEFORE THE END OF THE YEAR. HE ENVISIONS HAVING SOME SIXTY PARTICIPANTS ON EACH SIDE AT THE MADRID MEETING.

5. (U) DEVONIC NOTED THAT A GROUP OF EUROPEANS HAD RECENTLY GONE TO WASHINGTON TO DISCUSS THIS INITIATIVE AND THAT THEIR REPORT SHOULD BE AVAILABLE ON NOVEMBER 3. JONES MENTIONED THAT HE HAD WRITTEN JOHN LANCASTER, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE PRESIDENT'S COMMITTEE ON EMPLOYMENT OF PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES, BUT HAD NOT RECEIVED A REPLY. THE DCM OBSERVED THAT THIS INITIATIVE COULD BE AN ATTRACTIVE "DELIVERABLE" FOR THE DECEMBER U.S.-EU SUMMIT.

CODES OF CONDUCT IN THE CONTEXT OF THE U.S. APPAREL INDUSTRY PARTNERSHIP (AIP) WHICH SECRETARY HERMAN AND COMMISSIONER FLYNN HAD AGREED TO AT THEIR OCTOBER 14 MEETING IN PARIS. JONES ADDED THAT IT WAS IMPORTANT THAT THIS INITIATIVE BE HANDLED IN A WAY THAT PROVIDED FOR THE FULL PARTICIPATION OF THE "SOCIAL PARTNERS," PARTICULARLY MANUFACTURERS AND DISTRIBUTORS. FAILURE TO DO SO COULD UNDERCUT OUR BEST EFFORTS TO ACHIEVE WHAT HE REGARDED AS A HIGHLY DESIRABLE INITIATIVE.

7. (SBU) FLYNN ALSO NEEDED A GUARANTEE THAT PARTICIPATING FIRMS WOULD COMMIT THEMSELVES TO AN AIP-TYPE CODE OF CONDUCT AT THE SYMPOSIUM. THEIR COMMITMENT, IN TURN, WOULD HAVE A "SNOWBALL" EFFECT, LEADING TO THE INVOLVEMENT OF NGO'S AND TO SIMILAR AGREEMENTS IN OTHER SECTORS. JONES URGED THAT ALL CONCERNED AVOID INVOLVING THE TRANSATLANTIC LABOR DIALOGUE (TALD) IN PLANNING FOR THE SYMPOSIUM. SUCH A DEVELOPMENT, HE WARNED, WOULD BE "THE KISS OF DEATH" SINCE BUSINESS WOULD IMMEDIATELY BACK OFF IF OPENLY PUSHED BY LABOR. GOVERNMENT SHOULD TAKE THE LEAD, JONES STRESSED.

8. (U) JONES CONTINUED THAT DG V WOULD NEED ANOTHER THREE WEEKS OF IN-HOUSE PLANNING BEFORE BEING READY TO ENGAGE WITH DOL ON THIS SYMPOSIUM. TIME WAS SHORT, DEVONIC OBSERVED, SO IT WOULD BE NECESSARY TO MOVE FAST. THE SYMPOSIUM WOULD HAVE TO BE HELD IN FEBRUARY, JONES EXPLAINED, AT EITHER END OF THE G-8 EMPLOYMENT SUMMIT, TO ENABLE

SECRETARY HERMAN TO PARTICIPATE. SHE WOULD BE UNABLE TO MAKE TWO TRIPS TO EUROPE EARLY NEXT YEAR.

9. (U) THE DCM NOTED THAT THINGS WERE MOVING AHEAD ON OTHER FRONTS AS WELL. THE FORTHCOMING SUB-CABINET MEETING, THE ROME TRANSATLANTIC BUSINESS DIALOGUE (TABD) MEETING, AND THE NEXT NTA SENIOR LEVEL GROUP (SLG) MEETING WOULD ALL PROBABLY ADDRESS THE IDEA OF A EUROPEAN "SWEATSHOP" SYMPOSIUM. THE BRITISH PRESIDENCY, HE SUGGESTED, MIGHT ALSO CONSTITUTE A GOOD OPPORTUNITY TO ADVANCE THIS INITIATIVE.

10. (SBU) JONES DISCLOSED THAT THE PRESIDENCY (LUXEMBOURG) WAS INSISTING THAT THE COMMISSION REPORT TO THE DECEMBER HEALTH COUNCIL ON THE STATUS OF THE NTA PUBLIC HEALTH INITIATIVE. ALTHOUGH SOME COMMISSION OFFICIALS OPPOSED SUCH A REPORT, FOR REASONS WHICH JONES PROFESSED IGNORANCE OF, THE COMMISSION WOULD HAVE TO COMPLY WITH THE PRESIDENCY'S REQUEST. FLYNN WOULD HAVE TO PROVIDE A "POLITICAL ASSESSMENT" OF WHERE THINGS STOOD, PRECEDED BY SOME FAIRLY DIRECT EXCHANGES AMONG DG V OFFICIALS. PUBLIC HEALTH ISSUES, JONES ADDED, TENDED TO "SINK INTO TECHNICAL GROUPS AND NOT RESURFACE." PERHAPS, HE MUSED, IT WOULD HELP IF FLYNN INVITED SECRETARY OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES SHALALA TO VISIT BRUSSELS; THEY HAD NOT SEEN EACH OTHER SINCE THEIR FIRST MEETING IN MAY, 1996. JONES SUGGESTED THAT USEU AND DG V MEET AGAIN ON PUBLIC HEALTH AFTER NOVEMBER 15.

JONES STRESSED THAT, WHOEVER WAS RESPONSIBLE, DG V WAS STILL "WILLING" TO COOPERATE AND SUGGESTED THAT YET ANOTHER EFFORT BE MADE TO DO SO. THE DCM AGREED.

14. (SBU) THE FEBRUARY SWEATSHOP SYMPOSIUM AND THE MADRID MEETING ON THE DISABLED COULD BE GOOD INITIATIVES FOR THE DECEMBER SUMMIT. IT IS ESSENTIAL, HOWEVER, THAT BOTH SIDES ENGAGE EARLY ON TO ENSURE THEIR SUCCESS. FUNDING WILL ALSO BE A FACTOR IN THE SUCCESS OF THE MADRID MEETING; IT WILL BE NECESSARY TO FIND U.S. SOURCES TO COVER THE EXPENSES OF U.S. PARTICIPANTS. (WE ESTIMATE THE COST OF FUNDING 60 OF THEM TO BE ABOUT 100,000 DOLLARS.) JONES REGRETS THE DIFFICULTY WHICH OSHA AND DG V HAVE HAD IN FORGING MORE COOPERATIVE RELATIONS BUT STRESSES THE LATTER'S DESIRE TO KEEP TRYING. USEU SUPPORTS CONTINUED EFFORTS IN THIS REGARD AND STANDS READY TO SUPPORT NEW INITIATIVES. USEU WOULD APPRECIATE ADDRESSEES' ASSESSMENT OF THE STATUS OF NTA PUBLIC HEALTH INITIATIVES IN ORDER TO BE ABLE TO ENGAGE WITH DG V ON THEM IN THE NEAR FUTURE.
