



RESOLUTION NO. 89 OF 1993  
CONDEMNING THE SHOOT TO KILL POLICY AND OTHER  
VIOLATIONS OF HUMAN RIGHTS IN NORTHEAST IRELAND

*Darden/Lawless: Unanimous*

WHEREAS, the number of civilians shot dead by the English forces in Northeast Ireland is unacceptable, and

WHEREAS, the failure of the English Government to curb these killings supports the view that a certain level of death is officially regarded as acceptable on the condition that it is primarily confined to one section of the community, and

WHEREAS, the law governing the use of deadly force by the police and army is inadequate, and

WHEREAS, the continuing failure of successive English Governments to bring the operation of domestic law into line with Article 6 of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights and Article 2 of the European Convention on Human Rights and Fundamental Freedoms, to both of which the English Government is a party, is unacceptable, and

WHEREAS, we find that the misuse of firearms by the English forces in Northeast Ireland is part of a broader pattern of Human rights violations, and

WHEREAS, the Multi-Services Committee has met, considered, and by a unanimous vote approved this resolution, now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Legislature of Rockland County, New York hereby condemns these acts of violence by the English Government upon the Irish people and strongly urges the Government of the United States to open a Congressional Investigation as to these violations, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Legislature of Rockland County, New York hereby requests the Government of the United States to ban all arms exports to the English military and the Royal Ulster Constabulary pending a full Congressional debate on the violations of Civil and Human Rights in Northeast Ireland by the English forces, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Clerk to the Legislature of Rockland County be and he hereby is directed to send a copy of this resolution to the Hon. William Jefferson Clinton, President of the United States; the English Ambassador to the United States; Senators Alphonse D'Amato and Daniel Patrick Moynahan; Congressman Benjamin Gilman; the Majority and Minority Leaders of the United States Senate and House, and to such other persons as the Clerk, in his discretion, may feel proper to effectuate the purpose of this resolution.
