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

Caro Presidente,

rispondo alla Tua lettera sul Vertice della NATO che il Governo degli Stati Uniti ospiterà prossimamente a Washington, ed a quella del 18 che vi fa seguito.

Per quanto attiene al contesto generale dell'Alleanza, condivido molti dei Tuoi pensieri. Sta a noi, all'Alleanza, da poco estesa fino a ricomprendere i nemici di ieri, segnare la via lungo la quale avviarci entrando nel XXI secolo. Cinquant'anni di stabilità e sicurezza in Europa sono le principali credenziali della NATO. Nei nostri Paesi vi sono molte attese nei riguardi di un'Alleanza necessariamente diversa da quella che venne istituita mezzo secolo fa.

Quanto alle Tue riflessioni sulla revisione del concetto strategico, abbiamo posizioni, in gran parte, convergenti. Vorrei brevemente riprendere alcuni temi cui Tu accenni nella Tua lettera, che ritengo di grande importanza.

In primo luogo, la crescente ampiezza degli obiettivi dell'Alleanza corrisponde ad un'estensione della sua competenza geografica: la sicurezza all'interno dei confini dell'Alleanza è infatti strettamente legata alla stabilità della sua periferia.

Ciò conduce a due conclusioni. Se guardiamo alle aree più turbolente di tale periferia credo che il principio della "porta aperta" vada riaffermato in termini decisi guardando senza esitazione all'Europa Sud-Orientale. Quest'area, alla quale specificatamente Ti riferisci nella Tua lettera, va stabilizzata attraverso un saldo ancoraggio alla comunità transatlantica. In tale contesto, l'Italia continua a ritenere che particolare attenzione debba essere rivolta alle candidature della Slovenia e della Romania.

Il Vertice di Washington dovrebbe confermare l'importanza della zona balcanica e di quella ad essa attigua in previsione di una futura seconda fase di allargamento dell'Alleanza. La crisi nel Kossovo non è forse il segno più evidente che tale regione merita un'attenzione prioritaria in vista di nuove adesioni?

In secondo luogo, le nuove dinamiche esterne ed interne all'Alleanza, cui ho brevemente accennato, necessitano di strumenti ed obiettivi concreti sui quali articolarsi. L'adattamento delle capacità militari in vista dell'integrazione dei nuovi membri e dell'adempimento di un ampio spettro di possibili missioni, anche non discendenti dall'art. 5, dovrà essere il criterio guida da seguire per la ristrutturazione delle forze armate dei Paesi alleati.

La NATO deve poter svolgere i propri compiti con efficacia e rapidità. Ma la sua azione deve mantenersi in un solco di legalità tracciato dai principi che ispirano le N.U. ed il diritto internazionale.

Le operazioni non previste dall'art. 5, come quella iniziata contro la RFJ, debbono essere dei fatti del tutto eccezionali, basati sul consenso dei 19, e richiedere comunque una particolare legittimazione giuridica ed uno specifico sostegno politico. La legittimazione potrà essere trovata, a mio parere, grazie al riferimento ai principi della legalità internazionale; il sostegno politico andrebbe garantito, da parte sua, attraverso una consultazione ed una conduzione collettiva svolta in forme rafforzate, nelle quali in particolar modo gli alleati più direttamente coinvolti possano riconoscersi. Su questo argomento ti allego una nota che incorpora alcune idee sulle quali lavoriamo, e che volentieri vedrei - se una formale

approvazione a Washington fosse prematura - salvaguardate per la prosecuzione della nostra riflessione comune.

Ciò appare essenziale anche per garantire con la massima efficacia il raccordo con i processi decisionali nazionali che - in assenza dell'automatismo previsto dall'applicazione dell'art. 5 - dovranno essere posti in opera per assicurare all'Alleanza il massimo di operatività.

Ma non è solo preparandoci ad azioni militari congiunte che assicureremo la pace. Per quanto riguarda le nuove missioni vorrei ricordare due aspetti sui quali l'Italia si concentra da tempo.

Il primo è il peace-keeping. La Bosnia ci aveva già insegnato molto. E' probabile che dal Kossovo avremo ancora molto da imparare. Ritengo che la NATO debba sviluppare dottrine e capacità operative in questo settore. Lo abbiamo sostenuto in ogni ambito e, da ultimo, nel quadro dell'iniziativa sulle nuove capacità di difesa.

Sul secondo, il ruolo umanitario della NATO, lavoriamo da mesi con coerenza ed insistenza. Purtroppo non sempre siamo stati ascoltati. Le centinaia di migliaia di rifugiati verso l'Albania, la Macedonia ed il Montenegro in provenienza dal Kossovo ci hanno dato ragione.

La sicurezza è inoltre sempre più data dalla prevenzione: è importante che la NATO segnali, in maniera chiara anche se non allarmistica, il proprio interesse al contenimento delle armi di distruzione di massa e dei loro vettori, coinvolgendo anche altri Paesi ed in particolare la Russia.

Sulla Russia desidero sviluppare alcune annotazioni forse già implicite nella Tua affermazione secondo la quale una partecipazione ad alto livello di Mosca al Vertice di Washington costituisce una delle massime priorità per gli Alleati. Mosca rappresenta un fattore imprescindibile per le prospettive di pace, sicurezza e stabilità dell'Europa di oggi e del futuro. Il mio Governo, di fronte alla crisi in Kossovo, continua ad esercitare ogni sforzo per sostenere il dialogo con Mosca e rinsaldare gli strappi cui si è assistito nei rapporti tra essa e la NATO.

L'attenzione in queste ore è puntata sul Kosovo. I cittadini dei nostri Paesi sono esposti ad una copertura dei media sulla NATO che non ha precedenti. E' importante non perdere questa occasione per sensibilizzare l'opinione pubblica su contenuti che vadano al di là della crisi contingente.

In questo quadro d'insieme, l'Europa si prepara a giocare un ruolo di crescente rilievo nel panorama della sicurezza. L'Identità Europea di Sicurezza e Difesa (IESD) deve rispondere a due ordini di esigenze: trovare la propria collocazione nell'alveo della NATO e, nel contempo, definire quelle caratteristiche che la distinguono da essa in quanto, appunto, "identità". La crescita dell'Unione Europea in campo politico, economico, finanziario e sociale non può non comprendere una parallela evoluzione nel campo della sicurezza.

Concordo dunque con la Tua proposta di emettere un comunicato breve ma ricco di contenuti, suscettibile di dare il senso, in modo chiaro e ben comprensibile, delle prospettive ed i compiti della nuova NATO.

In questo particolare momento, nel quale l'opinione pubblica dei nostri Paesi partecipa così intensamente alle vicende del conflitto per il Kosovo, il nostro incontro di Washington dovrebbe contribuire ad affrontare, con una seria e costruttiva riflessione collettiva, i molteplici interrogativi che si affacciano sempre quando si ricorre, anche in piena legittimità come in questo caso, all'uso della forza. E' inoltre la prima volta nella sua storia che la NATO si trova impegnata in un'azione del genere. Credo dunque che il nostro Vertice potrà avere tanto maggior successo quanto più saprà affrontare con onestà intellettuale i problemi attuali, evitando di proiettare l'immagine di un autocompiacimento eccessivo. Sono lieto che anche Tu hai colto l'importanza di limitare, di conseguenza, gli aspetti meramente celebrativi dell'incontro.

Penso che si debba dare inizio a una riflessione pacata, ma coraggiosa e se del caso innovativa tra noi, e rifuggire sia dall'eccessivo compiacimento secondo cui tutto va bene così, sia dalla tentazione di qualche conclusione sommaria. Avviamo invece, all'interno dell'Alleanza, un dialogo su come rafforzare in simili emergenze i nostri legami e i nostri canali. Il sostegno democratico all'interno dei nostri Paesi ne guadagnerà, e con esso l'Alleanza intera.

Ti ringrazio dunque di voler stimolare un'opportuna riflessione su questi ed altri temi oggetto del Vertice.

"Rome, April 21, 1999

Dear Mr. President,

I write in response to your letter about the NATO Summit that the U.S. Government will be hosting in Washington, D.C. and to its follow-up dated the 18.

As concerns the general outline of the Alliance, I am in agreement with many of your considerations. It is up to us, the Alliance, recently expanded to include even former enemies, to map out the path we should undertake as we come into the twenty first century. Fifty years of stability and security in Europe are NATO's main credentials. In our countries there are many expectations for an Alliance necessarily different from the one established half a century ago.

As to your thoughts on revising the strategic concept, our positions are, for the most part, converging. I would like to briefly take up several of the topics mentioned in your letter that I consider of great importance.

First, the expanding scope of the Alliance's objectives parallels the extension of its geographic domain: security within its borders is, in fact, strictly connected to the stability of its periphery.

This leads to two conclusions. Looking at the most turbulent areas of this periphery, I believe that the "open door" principle should be firmly restated, with Southern and Eastern Europe unequivocally in mind. This area, which you specifically reference in your letter, should be stabilized by anchoring it firmly to the transatlantic community. In this context, Italy holds fast to its belief that special attention should be assigned to the candidacies of Slovenia and Romania.

The Washington Summit should confirm the importance of the Balkans and its contiguous area envisioning a future, second expansion of the Alliance. Is not the Kosovo crisis perhaps the clearest signal of the priority attention the area merits in the prospect of new members?

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Second, the new external and internal dynamics of the Alliance that I touched on are needy of sound instruments and objects to brace them. Adaptation of the military capability in light of the integration of new members and the prosecution of a wide range of potential missions, including those not issuing from article 5, should serve as the guideline for restructuring the armed forces of Allied countries.

NATO should have the capability to perform its missions effectively and quickly, although its action should remain within a lawful passageway defined by the principles animating the United Nations and international law.

Operations not foreseen by article 5, like the one against the FRY, must be wholly exceptional cases, based on the consensus of the 19, and in all instances require particular juridical legitimacy and specific political support. In my opinion, legitimacy would find grounds in the reference to the principles of international law; political support would be guaranteed through consultation and collective leadership through strengthened formats that are found acceptable by the allies most directly involved. Attached is a note on this matter incorporating several ideas we are working on which I would be glad, should their formal approval in Washington be premature, to keep for review during our common reflection.

This appears imperative also to maximally guarantee the connection with national decision-making processes which, absent the automatism foreseen by application of article 5, must be conducted to ensure maximum operativity to the Alliance.

Yet preparing for joint military actions is not the only way in which we will assure peace. As concerns the new missions, I would recall two aspects on which Italy has been focusing for some time.

The first is peace-keeping. We had already learned a great deal from Bosnia, and it is likely that there is much that remains to be learned from Kosovo. I believe that NATO must develop doctrines and operating capabilities in this sector. We have said so at every opportunity, most recently within the framework of the initiative on new defense capabilities.

The second aspect we have been consistently and steadfastly working on for months is NATO's humanitarian role. Sadly, we have not always been heard. The hundreds of thousands of refugees coming from Kosovo toward Albania, Macedonia, and Montenegro proved we were right.

Furthermore, security is more and more often the result of prevention. It is important that NATO give a clear—albeit not alarmist—signal of its interest in the containment of weapons of mass destruction and their vectors, involving other countries as well, Russia in particular.

As concerns Russia, I would like to further explore some observations already implicit perhaps in your affirmation that a high level participation of Moscow in the Washington Summit is one of the highest priorities of the Allies. Moscow is indispensable to any vision of peace, security and stability in Europe today and tomorrow. My Government, faced with the crisis in Kosovo, continues to spare no efforts to maintain dialogue with Moscow and re-cement the visible cracks in its relations with NATO.

At present, attention is focused on Kosovo. The citizens of our countries are exposed to unprecedented media coverage of NATO. It is important that we not miss this opportunity to sensitize public opinion on elements above and beyond the current crisis.

Against this general framework, Europe is gearing for an increasingly visible role in the security platform. The European Security and Defense Identity (ESDI) must satisfy two orders of needs: finding its place in the NATO context while at the same time defining what characteristics distinguish ESDI from NATO, as ESDI is indeed itself an identity. The growth of the European Union politically, economically, financially and socially cannot fail to see a parallel evolution in security.

Thus I agree with your proposal to issue a brief but substantively cogent communiqué suited to clearly and cogently give a sense of the new NATO's prospects and roles.

In this moment in particular, when the public opinion of our countries is so intensely taken up by the events of the Kosovo conflict, our meeting in Washington should contribute, with a sober and constructive common reflection, to tackling the many questions that are always raised, even in fully legitimated cases such as this, by recourse to the use of force. Moreover, it is the first time in history that NATO sees itself involved in an action of this kind. Therefore, I think our Summit will be all the more successful if we approach the current problems in a straightforward way and take care not to project images of excessive self-satisfaction. I am glad that you too have recognized the importance of consequently limiting the purely celebratory aspects of the gathering.

As to our most pressing concerns of these days, which motivated your second letter, I wish to add several thoughts.

There are two very important points in your letter:

One, the need for a long term plan to promote the stability and security of southeastern Europe. I could not be more convinced of this need and I am glad that you share this notion.

Two, the conclusions to be drawn within the Atlantic Alliance from the experience that has been forced on us by events during the course of the crisis in Yugoslavia and more recently in Kosovo. I think that a serious, courageous, and if necessary, innovative reflection be installed among us, and that we should stand guard against both excessive self-satisfied attitudes of everything is going as it should and temptations to summarily draw conclusions. Let us instead set a dialogue under way within the Alliance about how to strengthen our ties and our channels of communication in similar emergencies. It will serve to benefit democratic support within our countries and with this, the entire Alliance.

I am appreciative of your intent to stimulate adequate reflection on these and other topics of the Summit.

I look forward to our meeting on that occasion.

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





We, the Heads of State and Government of the member countries of the North Atlantic Alliance, declare for a new century our mutual commitment to defend our people, our territory and our liberty, founded on democracy, human rights and the rule of law. The world has changed dramatically over the last half century, but our common values and security interests remain the same.

2. At this anniversary summit, we affirm our determination to continue advancing these goals, building on the habits of trust and co-operation we have developed over fifty years. Collective defence remains the core purpose of NATO. We affirm our commitment to promote peace, stability and freedom.

3. We pay tribute to the men and women who have served our Alliance and who have advanced the cause of freedom. To honour them and to build a better future, we will contribute to building a stronger and broader Euro-Atlantic community of democracies - a community where human rights and fundamental freedoms are upheld; where borders are increasingly open to people, ideas and commerce; where war becomes unthinkable.

4. We reaffirm our faith, as stated in the North Atlantic Treaty, in the purposes and principles of the Charter of the United Nations and reiterate our desire to live in peace with all nations, and to settle any international dispute by peaceful means.

5. We must be as effective in the future in dealing with new challenges as we were in the past. We are charting NATO's course as we enter the 21st century: an Alliance committed to collective defence, capable of addressing current and future risks to our security, strengthened by and open to new members, and working together with other institutions, Partners and Mediterranean Dialogue countries in a mutually reinforcing way to enhance Euro-Atlantic security and stability.

6. NATO embodies the vital partnership between Europe and North America. We welcome the further impetus that has been given to the strengthening of European defence capabilities to enable the European Allies to act more effectively together, thus reinforcing the transatlantic partnership.

7. We remain determined to stand firm against those who violate human rights, wage war and conquer territory. We will maintain both the political solidarity and the military forces necessary to protect our nations and to meet the security challenges of the next century. We pledge to improve our defence capabilities to fulfill the full range of the Alliance's 21st century missions. We will continue to build confidence and security through arms control, disarmament and non-proliferation measures. We reiterate our condemnation of terrorism and our determination to protect ourselves against this scourge.

8. Our Alliance remains open to all European democracies, regardless of geography, willing and able to meet the responsibilities of membership, and whose inclusion would enhance overall security and stability in Europe. NATO is an essential pillar of a wider community of shared values and shared responsibility. Working together, Allies and Partners, including Russia and Ukraine, are developing their cooperation and erasing the divisions imposed by the Cold War to help to build a Europe whole and free, where security and prosperity are shared and indivisible.

9. Fifty years after NATO's creation, the destinies of North America and Europe remain inseparable. When we act together, we safeguard our freedom and security and enhance stability more effectively than any of us could alone. Now, and for the century about to begin, we declare as the fundamental objectives of this Alliance enduring peace, security and liberty for all people of Europe and North America.







6. NATO embodies the vital partnership between Europe and North America. We welcome the further impetus that has been given to the strengthening of European defence capabilities to enable the European Allies to act more effectively together, thus reinforcing the transatlantic partnership.

7. We remain determined to stand firm against those who violate human rights, wage war and conquer territory. We will maintain both the political solidarity and the military forces necessary to protect our nations and to meet the security challenges of the next century. We pledge to improve our defence capabilities to fulfill the full range of the Alliance's 21st century missions. We will continue to build confidence and security through arms control, disarmament and non-proliferation measures. We reiterate our condemnation of terrorism and our determination to protect ourselves against this scourge.

8. Our Alliance remains open to all European democracies, regardless of geography, willing and able to meet the responsibilities of membership, and whose inclusion would enhance overall security and stability in Europe. NATO is an essential pillar of a wider community of shared values and shared responsibility. Working together, Allies and Partners, including Russia and Ukraine, are developing their cooperation and erasing the divisions imposed by the Cold War to help to build a Europe whole and free, where security and prosperity are shared and indivisible.

9. Fifty years after NATO's creation, the destinies of North America and Europe remain inseparable. When we act together, we safeguard our freedom and security and enhance stability more effectively than any of us could alone. Now, and for the century about to begin, we declare as the fundamental objectives of this Alliance enduring peace, security and liberty for all people of Europe and North America.


