Dear Bruce:

I am grateful for your thoughtful and specific suggestions on Northern Ireland -- and I also want to thank you again for your work in laying the foundations for successful U.S. involvement in the peace process during these last several years.

Your insights track very much with our own: on the need to reach out to loyalists, on the need to "get policing right," and on the role my possible visit to the region late this year might play in helping to maintain momentum on implementation of the Good Friday Accord. We have already taken up some of your suggestions -- for example, we met with loyalist political representatives and others in Belfast in early November.

I know the two governments and the parties are working hard to overcome current difficulties. I remain determined to help the process in any way I can during the remainder of my Administration. Your offer to play an intermediary role is one I will bear in mind as we consider next steps over the coming weeks.

Again, thank you for your personal commitment and dedication to the cause of lasting peace in Ireland.
