SUBJECT: LOCAL REACTION TO POSTPONEMENT OF MAJOR-BRUTON SUMMIT

1. SUMMARY. THE POSTPONEMENT OF THE SEPTEMBER 6 MAJOR-BRUTON SUMMIT HAS BEEN GREETED WITH RELIEF BY BOTH

UNIONISTS AND NATIONALISTS, ALTHOUGH FOR OPPOSITE REASONS. UNIONISTS HAD BEEN CONCERNED THAT THE BRITISH

GOVERNMENT WOULD NOT STAND FIRM BEHIND ITS COMMITMENT TO INSIST ON MOVEMENT ON THE DECOMMISSIONING ISSUE AND WERE RELIEVED THAT IT HAD, WHILE NATIONALISTS EXPRESSED RELIEF THAT THE IRISH GOVERNMENT HAD NOT AGREED TO THE COMMISSION IN THE FACE OF SINN FEIN'S REJECTION OF THE IDEA.
END SUMMARY.

2. EACH OF THE THREE BELFAST DAILIES RAN THE SUMMIT STORY AS THEIR FRONT PAGE HEADLINER SEPTEMBER 6. THE PRO-UNIONIST "NEWSLETTER" RAN THE HEADLINE "EIRE CALLS OFF SUMMIT, THE PRO-NATIONALIST "IRISH NEWS" THE HEADLINE "SUMMIT TALKS CALLED OFF AT LAST MINUTE". THE NEUTRAL AFTERNOON DAILY, THE "BELFAST TELEGRAPH" RAN THE LARGE HEADLINE "PRESSURE POINT" OVER A SMALLER HEADLINE "MAJOR TRIES TO GET TALKS BACK ON COURSE". BACK PAGES OF THE "TELEGRAPH" RAN RELATED STORIES WITH HEADLINES LIKE "ULSTER PARTIES UNITE TO WELCOME DELAYS" AND "NIO BAFFLED AND FURIOUS." ALL THREE PAPERS AGREED THAT IT WAS THE DUBLIN GOVERNMENT WHICH HAD PULLED OUT OF THE SUMMIT AND THAT THE BRITISH GOVERNMENT HAD BEEN GIVEN VERY LITTLE ADVANCE WARNING.

3. LOCAL PAPERS ALSO AGREED THAT DIFFERENCES OF OPINION

ON DECOMMISSIONING HAD LED TO THE POSTPONEMENT. REPORTEDLY, THE BRITISH GOVERNMENT HAD STOOD BY ITS COMMITMENT TO REQUIRE MOVEMENT ON DECOMMISSIONING BEFORE SINN FEIN WOULD BE PERMITTED TO PARTICIPATE IN ALL-PARTY TALKS. THE IRISH GOVERNMENT HAD ADOPTED A POSITION CLOSER TO THAT OF THE SDLP OR OF SINN FEIN, SUPPORTING THE IDEA OF ALL-PARTY TALKS WITH DECOMMISSIONING AS PART OF AN OVERALL NEGOTIATED SETTLEMENT. WHILE THE TWO GOVERNMENTS HAD REACHED AGREEMENT IN PRINCIPLE ON THE IDEA OF AN INTERNATIONAL COMMISSION AS A WAY THROUGH THE DECOMMISSIONING IMPASSE, SINN FEIN'S STATED REFUSAL TO COOPERATE WITH SUCH A BODY REPORTEDLY SOURED THE IRISH GOVERNMENT ON THE PROPOSAL, OR AT LEAST THE CURRENT CONCEPTION OF THE COMMISSION'S ROLE, LEADING TO THE LAST MINUTE POSTPONEMENT.

4. ALLIANCE PARTY DEPUTY LEADER SEAMUS CLOSE SAID THE POSTPONEMENT OF THE SUMMIT WAS A CLEAR INDICATION THAT THE DUBLIN GOVERNMENT HAD SUCCUMBED TO "CRISIS OVERTURES BY SINN FEIN AND THE SDLP.....THAT BEGS THE QUESTION, DO THEY REALLY BELIEVE THE CEASEFIRE IS PERMANENT? ARE WE BEING TEASED OR THREATENED" HE ASKED. HE CALLED THE POSTPONEMENT A CLEAR INDICATION THAT DUBLIN WAS PREPARED TO GIVE IN TO THREATS.

5. OUTGOING ULSTER UNIONIST LEADER JAMES MOLYNEAUX HAD A SIMILAR REACTION, SAYING THAT "UNDER PRESSURE FROM THE IRA, THE IRISH GOVERNMENT HAVE BACKED AWAY FROM THEIR OWN COMMITMENT TO ARTICLE 10 OF THE (DOWNING STREET) DECLARATION.* (ARTICLE 10 REQUIRED PARTIES TO DEMONSTRATE A COMMITMENT TO EXCLUSIVELY PEACEFUL MEANS.) MOLYNEAUX SAID THAT HIS OWN INVOLVEMENT DURING THE DRAFTING STAGES OF THE DECLARATION MADE IT CLEAR TO HIM THAT THE IRISH GOVERNMENT UNDERSTOOD THAT ARTICLE 10 WAS INTENDED TO REFER TO THE HANDING IN OF WEAPONS, AND HE WARNED THAT, SHOULD HMG COMPROMISE ON THIS COMMITMENT, "CONFIDENCE IN BOTH GOVERNMENTS WOULD BE SHATTERED TO SUCH AN EXTENT THAT IDEAS FOR INTER-PARTY TALKS WOULD BE QUITE IRRELEVANT."

6. SOME OBSERVERS HAVE POINTED OUT THAT IT WAS ALWAYS INEXPEDIENT FOR THE TWO GOVERNMENTS TO HOLD A SUMMIT AND TO MAKE CRITICAL ANNOUNCEMENTS ON THE FUTURE OF THE PEACE PROCESS TWO DAYS BEFORE THE SEPTEMBER 8 COUNCIL TO SELECT A NEW LEADER OF THE UUP. THIS TIMING MADE IT INEVITABLE THAT THE LEADERSHIP CONTENDERS WOULD VIE WITH ONE ANOTHER TO BE THE MOST SCATHING IN THEIR CRITICISM OF WHATEVER ARRANGEMENTS WERE ANNOUNCED AT THE SUMMIT. FOLLOWING THE POSTPONEMENT, MOST OF THE CANDIDATES HAVE CRITICIZED THE BRITISH GOVERNMENT FOR NOT MORE FULLY CONSULTING WITH UNIONISTS DURING THE ENTIRE PROCESS. JOHN TAYLOR, THE CURRENT FRONT RUNNER ACCORDING TO THE BOOKMAKERS, MADE CLEAR HIS PARTY'S IRRITATION AT WHAT HE SAW AS THE SIDELINING OF UNIONISTS. HE SAID THAT IT WAS CLEAR THAT THERE WAS FULL CONSULTATION WITHIN THE "PAN-NATIONALIST FRONT" -- THE UNCLAS SECTION 02 OF 03 BELFAST 0372

IRISH GOVERNMENT, SINN FEIN, AND THE SDLP -- WHILE THE
BRITISH GOVERNMENT SOUGHT TO NEGOTIATE ARRANGEMENTS

FOR ALL-PARTY TALKS WITHOUT REFERENCE TO THE LARGEST
PARTY IN THE PROVINCE. TAYLOR WARNED THAT "NO ONE HAS

THE AUTHORITY TO AGREE ALL-PARTY TALKS WITHOUT
CONSULTATION WITH, AND THE AGREEMENT OF, THE UUP."

6. TAYLOR'S RIVAL DAVID TRIMBLE ECHOED TAYLOR'S SENTIMENT
THAT THE UUP NEEDED TO BE A KEY PLAYER IN ANY ATTEMPT TO
MOVE THE PEACE PROCESS FORWARD. HE SAID THAT, IF SELECTED
AS LEADER OF THE UUP, HE WOULD WISH FIRST TO HAVE SERIOUS
DISCUSSIONS WITH ALL OF THE MAJOR PLAYERS IN THE PEACE
PROCESS, IN NORTHERN IRELAND, BRITAIN, AND THE REPUBLIC --
EXCEPT SINN FEIN, WHICH STILL HAD TO DEMONSTRATE ITS
COMMITMENT TO EXCLUSIVELY PEACEFUL MEANS, WITH
DECOMMISSIONING AS ONE POSSIBLE WAY TO DO THAT.
"UNFORTUNATELY," HE SAID, "EVERYTHING SINN FEIN SAYS AND
DOES SHOWS THEY ARE NOT COMMITTED TO EXCLUSIVELY
PEACEFUL MEANS. THERE IS FAR TOO MUCH DOUBLE TALK, FAR
TOO MUCH IMPLICIT THREAT OF RENEWED VIOLENCE. THEY
REALLY DO HAVE TO CHANGE." TRIMBLE URGED THE IRISH
GOVERNMENT TO LET GO OF ITS ROMANTIC ATTACHMENT TO ALL-
IRELAND NATIONALISM AND ENTER INTO THE POST-NATIONALIST
WESTERN EUROPE "WITH THE REST OF US."

7. KEN MAGINNIS, A THIRD CANDIDATE FOR THE UUP LEADERSHIP,
PRAISED THE BRITISH GOVERNMENT FOR STANDING FIRM ON
DECOMMISSIONING. HE SAID THAT "AT LONG LAST THE BRITISH
GOVERNMENT HAS DECIDED ENOUGH IS ENOUGH, WHILST ONCE
AGAIN DUBLIN HAS CAVED INTO PRESSURE FROM THE IRA. IT
CERTAINLY LOOKS LIKE THE GOVERNMENT HAS FINALLY DRAWN
A LINE IN THE SAND.... IF THAT IS THE CASE THIS WILL BE LOOKED
BACK ON AS A WELCOME WATERSHED IN THE GOVERNMENT'S
POLICY."

8. FOR IAN PAISLEY'S DEMOCRATIC UNIONISTS, PARTY SECRETARY
NIGEL DODDS SAID THE SUMMIT WAS "DEGENERATING INTO A
FARCE.....(THE BRITISH GOVERNMENT'S) ATTEMPT TO FIND AN
AGREEMENT WITH DUBLIN AND SINN FEIN, WHICH WOULD THEN BE
PRESENTED TO UNIONISTS AS A FAIT ACCOMPLI, HAS BACK-FIRED,"
DODDS SAID. "THE ACTIONS OF JOHN MAJOR'S GOVERNMENT
DURING THE PAST 12 MONTHS LED SINN FEIN AND DUBLIN TO
EXPECT HIM TO BACK DOWN... AS HE HAS BACKED DOWN ON
EVERYTHING ELSE." DODDS ALSO BELIEVED THAT THIS EPISODE
DEMONSTRATED THAT HMG HAD "UNDERESTIMATED THE UNITY
OF PURPOSE OF THE PAN-NATIONALIST FRONT.... IT IS CLEAR THAT
THE PRESERVATION OF THAT FRONT IS MORE IMPORTANT TO
DUBLIN THAN ANYTHING ELSE." LIKE THE UUP, DODDS CALLED ON
THE BRITISH GOVERNMENT TO DO A BETTER JOB OF CONSULTING
WITH THE UNIONIST PARTIES.

9. THE SDLP'S MARK DURKAN JOINED UNIONISTS IN WELCOMING THE POSTPONEMENT, ALTHOUGH FOR VERY DIFFERENT REASONS. ALTHOUGH DISAPPOINTED AT THE DELAY, DURKAN SAID IT WAS BETTER TO POSTPONE THE SUMMIT THAN TO PRODUCE AN OUTCOME WHICH COULD DEEPEN THE CRISIS. CRITICIZING UNIONIST REACTION TO THE ANNOUNCEMENT, DURKAN SAID, "RESPONSIBLE POLITICS IS NOT ABOUT TAKING SATISFACTION FROM DIFFICULTIES OR TRYING TO EXPLOIT THOSE PROBLEMS, IT IS ABOUT TRYING TO MINIMIZE DIFFICULTIES AND SOLVE PROBLEMS." HE REJECTED UNIONIST CLAIMS THAT DUBLIN WAS TO BLAME FOR THE POSTPONEMENT, CLAIMING THE PROBLEMS HAD ARISEN BECAUSE OF BRITISH "BAD FAITH."

10. ALTHOUGH SINN FEIN IS REPORTEDLY PLEASED BY THE IRISH GOVERNMENT'S SUPPORT FOR ITS STANCE ON NO DECOMMISSIONING OF WEAPONS IN ADVANCE ON A NEGOTIATED SETTLEMENT, THE PARTY'S REPRESENTATIVES WERE RETICENT ABOUT PUBLICLY COMMENTING ON THE POSTPONEMENT. MITCHEL MCLAUGHLIN SAID ONLY THAT THE SETTING OF A NEW DATE FOR THE SUMMIT MEETING WAS A MATTER FOR THE TWO GOVERNMENTS. SPEAKING UPON ARRIVAL IN THE UNITED STATES, SINN FEIN VICE PRESIDENT MARTIN MCGUINNESS TOLD REPORTERS THAT NORTHERN IRELAND STILL DID NOT HAVE PEACE, "ONLY THE ILLUSION OF PEACE." MCGUINNESS SAID THE BRITISH GOVERNMENT HAD CREATED A CRISIS BY WHAT HE VIEWED AS ITS NEW DEMAND FOR AN IRA SURRENDER OF ARMS AS A PRE-CONDITION TO INCLUSION IN ALL-PARTY TALKS. "THERE IS INCREASING FRUSTRATION AT THE BRITISH STANCE," MCGUINNESS SAID.

11. COINCIDENTALLY, RUC CHIEF CONSTABLE SIR HUGH ANNESLEY GAVE AN INTERVIEW IN THE SEPTEMBER 6 "GUARDIAN" IN WHICH UNCLAS SECTION 03 OF 03 BELFAST 0372

SUBJECT: LOCAL REACTION TO POSTPONEMENT OF MAJOR-BRUTON SUMMIT

HE EXPRESSED HIS CONFIDENCE THAT THE REPUBLICAN LEADERSHIP HAD SUFFICIENT SUPPORT WITHIN THE MOVEMENT TO

MAINTAIN THE CEASEFIRE. REPUBLICAN SUPPORT FOR THE PEACE PROCESS AND THE LEADERSHIP WAS STRONG ENOUGH, SIR HUGH

BELIEVED, SO THAT GERRY ADAMS COULD PERSUADE THE IRA TO HAND OVER WEAPONS. THIS VIEW DIFFERS SHARPLY FROM SINN FEIN'S OWN POSITION THAT IT DOES NOT HAVE THE ABILITY TO DELIVER ANY MOVEMENT ON DECOMMISSIONING. ANNESLEY ALSO EXPRESSED CONFIDENCE THAT THE POSTPONEMENT OF THE ANGLO-IRISH SUMMIT DID NOT SIGNIFICANTLY INCREASE THE RISK OF A RETURN TO VIOLENCE.

SUBJECT: SINN FEIN MEETING WITH SECRETARY OF STATE FAILS TO
RESOLVE IMPASSE; SINN FEIN REJECTS INTERNATIONAL
COMMISSION ON DECOMMISSIONING

1. THE NORTHERN IRELAND SECRETARY OF STATE SIR PATRICK

MAYHEW MET SINN FEIN PRESIDENT GERRY ADAMS AT STORMONT ON SEPTEMBER 4. THE MEETING, THE THIRD IN RECENT WEEKS, WAS AN EFFORT TO RESOLVE THE IMPASSE OVER HMG'S INSISTENCE ON PROGRESS IN THE DECOMMISSIONING OF WEAPONS AND SINN FEIN'S INSISTENCE ON MOVING TO ALL PARTY TALKS. AFTERWARDS, HOWEVER, BOTH SIDES ADMITTED THAT THE TALKS HAD BEEN INCONCLUSIVE. SINN FEIN FAILED TO PERSUADE MAYHEW THAT A MOVE SHOULD BE MADE TO BEGIN ALL PARTY TALKS. ADAMS SAID, "WE WERE LOOKING FOR A POSITIVE RESPONSE TO PROPOSITIONS WHICH HAD BEEN PUT TO HIM AND WHICH WE SAW AS ENABLING EVERYONE TO MOVE TO ALL-PARTY TALKS WITHOUT ANYONE HAVING TO CLIMB DOWN. UNFORTUNATELY...HE WAS NOT ABLE TO RESPOND POSITIVELY TO THOSE SUGGESTIONS." HE DESCRIBED THE SITUATION AS "A DEFINING MOMENT IN WHICH THE BRITISH GOVERNMENT NEEDS TO MAKE IT CLEAR THAT IT IS COMMITTED TO BUILDING PEACE." HE FURTHER URGED MAYHEW TO RETHINK HIS POSITION. ADAMS ALSO DENOUNCED THE PROPOSAL OF AN INTERNATIONAL COMMISSION TO OVERSEE THE DECOMMISSIONING OF WEAPONS, STATING THAT SINN FEIN REGARD THE IDEA AS A SCHEME BY THE BRITISH TO SECURE THE DECOMMISSIONING OF THE IRA'S WEAPONS.

2. FOR HIS PART, THE SECRETARY OF STATE REITERATED HIS BELIEF THAT THERE WAS NO POINT IN ARRANGING ALL-PARTY TALKS IF THERE WAS GOING TO BE A LARGE NUMBER OF EMPTY CHAIRS AT THE TABLE. HE EMPHASIZED THAT THE IRA MUST MAKE A START ON THE DECOMMISSIONING OF WEAPONS TO ENABLE ALL-PARTY TALKS TO BEGIN. HE UNDERLINED THE NEED FOR ALL-PARTY TALKS TO TAKE PLACE WITHOUT THE "IMPLIED THREAT OF ACCESS TO WEAPONS BY FRIENDS OUTSIDE THE DOOR." AND, HE ASKED, IF THE IRA HAD THE POLITICAL COMMITMENT THEY WERE SUPPOSED TO HAVE, "HOW COME THEY WON'T EVEN MAKE A START ON DECOMMISSIONING"? HE SUGGESTED THE WORD "WON'T" NOT "CAN'T" WAS APPROPRIATE TO THE IRA'S REFUSAL TO MAKE A START ON DECOMMISSIONING, AND HE CALLED UPON THEM TO EXAMINE THEIR POSITION TO SEE "WHETHER THERE IS NOT ROOM TO MOVE SO THAT WE CAN GET TALKS GOING AROUND THE TABLE."

1. THE NEWLY ELECTED ULSTER UNIONIST LEADER, DAVID TRIMBLE, HAD A HOUR-LONG PRIVATE MEETING WITH SDLP CHIEF JOHN HUME

IN LONDONDERRY ON SEPTEMBER 14. THE MEETING IS PART OF A PROGRAM OF SIMILAR MEETINGS TRIMBLE INTENDS TO HOLD WITH

POLITICAL LEADERS IN NORTHERN IRELAND, THE IRISH REPUBLIC AND THE BRITISH MAINLAND. BOTH MEN SPOKE GENERALLY ABOUT THE OVERALL SITUATION IN THE PROVINCE, AND AGREED TO MEET AGAIN. "OBVIOUSLY, WE HAVE HAD SOME DISCUSSION ABOUT THE OVERALL SITUATION BUT I DON'T THINK IT WOULD BE HELPFUL TO GO INTO THAT IN DETAIL. WHAT WE HAVE AGREED THOUGH IS THAT THE CO-OPERATION BETWEEN OUR TWO PARTIES ON ECONOMIC MATTERS SHOULD CONTINUE."

2. FOR HIS PART, JOHN HUME DESCRIBED THE MEETING AS "ENCOURAGING" AND HE EXPRESSED THE HOPE THAT CO-OPERATION ON ECONOMIC ISSUES MIGHT LEAD TO THE BUILDING OF TRUST NECESSARY FOR THE PEACE PROCESS TO SUCCEED. "I FOUND THE MEETING VERY ENCOURAGING. WE DID NOT DISGUISE OUR POLITICAL DIFFERENCES. IF WE CAN WORK TOGETHER ON ECONOMIC ISSUES, IT WILL BUILD THE TRUST NEEDED TO RESOLVE OUR POLITICAL DIFFERENCES," HUME SAID. THE TWO LEADERS ARE TO SEEK A MEETING WITH BRITISH PRIME MINISTER MAJOR TO DISCUSS ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENTS, SIGNALING THAT THE COOPERATION BETWEEN THE TWO PARTIES ON ECONOMIC ISSUES WILL CONTINUE, DESPITE THE CHANGE IN THE UUP LEADERSHIP.
