SUBJECT: DRUMCREE STAND-OFF ENTERS THIRD DAY AFTER

SECOND NIGHT OF PROVINCE-WIDE DEMONSTRATIONS

REF: BELFAST 0166 AND PREVIOUS

1. SUMMARY: AS THE DRUMCREE STAND-OFF BETWEEN THE POLICE AND THE ORANGE ORDER CONTINUES, VIOLENCE FLARED IN VARIOUS PARTS OF NORTHERN IRELAND FOR A SECOND NIGHT. UNIONIST LEADERS TRIMBLE, PAISLEY AND MCCARTNEY HAVE DECIDED THEY WILL NOT RETURN TO TALKS AT STORMONT UNTIL DRUMCREE IS "RESOLVED." FEARS ARE MOUNTING THAT THE KILLING OF A CATHOLIC TAXI DRIVER MAY SIGNAL THE END OF THE LOYALIST CEASE-FIRE. END SUMMARY.
2. THERE WERE INTERMITTENT BUT WIDESPREAD DISTURBANCES IN NORTHERN IRELAND DURING THE NIGHT OF JULY 8 AS THE "SIEGE OF DRUMCREE" ENTERED ITS THIRD DAY. SEVERAL CATHOLIC FAMILIES WERE FORCED TO FLEE THEIR HOMES AS RIOTING ERUPTED IN THE OLDPARK DISTRICT OF NORTH BELFAST. A CATHOLIC SCHOOL IN THE BALLYSILLAN DISTRICT OF NORTH

BELFAST WAS BADLY DAMAGED BY FIRE. CARS WERE SET ALIGHT IN THE EAST OF THE CITY. OTHER AREAS INCLUDING COLERAINE, NEWTOWNARDS, AND LURGAN BECAME NO-GO AREAS AS BARRICADES WERE ERECTED. MAIN ROADS WERE BLOCKED BY PROTESTORS - THE MAIN BELFAST TO DUBLIN ROAD WAS CLOSED FOR A TIME, AS WAS THE ROAD TO THE INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT WHEN IT WAS BLOCKED BY A CROWD OF UP TO 1,000 LOYALISTS. TRAVELLERS TRYING TO CATCH PLANES HAD TO LEAVE THEIR CARS ON THE ROADSIDE AND RUN FOR THEIR FLIGHTS. THE PORT OF LARNE WAS CLOSED AFFECTING FERRY TRAFFIC AND RAIL SERVICES WERE DISRUPTED BY PHONED BOMB WARNINGS. ALL TOGETHER THERE WERE OVER TWENTY ARRESTS AND EIGHT PEOPLE WERE INJURED.

3. ONE OF THE FEW AREAS WHICH WAS CALM WAS DRUMCREE ITSELF. THE ORANGEMEN, WHO WERE AGAIN JOINED BY THOUSANDS OF SUPPORTERS, WERE KEPT INFORMED OF DEVELOPMENTS PROVINCE-WIDE. THEY SPENT A PEACEFUL NIGHT; HEAVY RAIN DID NOT DETER THEIR SPIRITS, AND THE SINGING DEMOCRATIC UNIONIST M.P., REV. WILLIAM MCCREA ENTERTAINED THEM. HOWEVER, THERE WAS NO HINT OF ANY COMPROMISE ON THEIR INSISTENCE THAT THE POLICE PERMIT THEM TO MARCH DOWN A ROAD THROUGH A NATIONALIST AREA. ULSTER UNIONIST LEADER DAVID TRIMBLE SAID, "THERE IS ABSOLUTELY NO CHANGE IN THE DETERMINATION HERE. INDEED, IF ANYTHING, THE DEGREE OF SUPPORT AND THE QUANTITY OF SUPPORT LAST NIGHT HAS ENCOURAGED THEM." HIS PARTY COLLEAGUE, JEFFREY DONALDSON, PUT THE BLAME FOR THE DISTURBANCES SQUARELY ON THE CHIEF CONSTABLE. "WE'RE SAYING, DON'T BLAME US, BLAME THE RUC." UK UNIONIST ROBERT MCCARTNEY, WHO WAS ALSO AT DRUMCREE, OPINED, "IT'S A SAD DAY FOR THE RUC THAT UNDER THE DIRECTION OF INCOMPETENT DONKEYS LIKE THE CHIEF CONSTABLE, THEY SHOULD BE PLACED IN THIS SITUATION."

4. FAMILIES OF POLICEMEN ON DUTY AT DRUMCREE HAVE VOICED THEIR COERN FOR THEIR SAFETY. MANY OFFICERS ARE LOCAL AND ARE WELL KNOWN TO THE ORANGEMEN. SEVERAL POLICE FAMILY MEMBERS CALLED A LOCAL NEWSPAPER TO SPEAK OF THREATS THEY HAD RECEIVED.

5. REPRESENTATIVES OF THE MAINSTREAM UNIONIST PARTIES HAVE INDICATED THEY WILL NOT BE RETURNING TO THE TALKS CHAIRED BY SENATOR MITCHELL UNTIL THE DRUMCREE SITUATION IS RESOLVED. AN ULSTER UNIONIST PARTY MEMBER SAID, "WE WILL BE TELLING MR. MITCHELL THAT WE THINK WE WOULD BE BETTER EMPLOYED AT THE MOMENT IN OTHER PARTS OF NORTHERN IRELAND TRYING TO DEFUSE THE PRESENT DANGEROUS SITUATION." THE DEMOCRATIC UNIONISTS AND THE UK UNIONISTS WILL ALSO STAY AWAY FROM THE TALKS. HOWEVER, GARY MCMICHAEL OF THE ULSTER

TALKS. HE SAID, "I STILL BELIEVE IT IS NECESSARY FOR  
DIALOGUE TO TAKE PLACE IN SOME FORM AND I WOULD

STORMONT. WE WILL BE AT STORMONT TOMORROW."  
THE SDLP'S MARK DURKAN CRITICISED THE UNIONIST  
DECISION TO WITHDRAW FROM THE TALKS. HE SAID THE  
PUBLIC WOULD NOT WANT TO SEE THE POLITICAL  
PROCESS DISPLACED OR ABANDONED. DURKAN ASKED  
WHAT WAS THE ALTERNATIVE TO POLITICAL TALKS - WAS  
IT SHOUTING IN THE STREETS, OR WORSE STILL SHOOTING  
IN THE STREETS?

6. THE MURDER OF THE 31 YEAR OLD TAXI DRIVER,  
MICHAEL MCGOLDRICK, WHO WAS SHOT DEAD IN HIS  
VEHICLE IN THE EARLY HOURS OF JULY 8, HAS RAISED  
FEARS THAT THE LOYALIST CEASE-FIRE IS IN JEOPARDY.  
THE KILLING HAPPENED JUST A FEW MILES FROM  
DRUMCREE, AND WHILE POLICE HAVE STATED THAT THEY  
ARE KEEPING AN OPEN MIND ON THE KILLING, IT BEARS  
ALL THE HALLMARKS OF MID-ULSTER PARAMILITARIES  
WHO ARE KNOWN TO BE UNHAPPY ABOUT RECENT  
POLITICAL DEVELOPMENTS. THE KILLING HAS BEEN  
CONDEMNED BY MANY UNIONIST POLITICIANS.

7. ADVICE TO U.S. CITIZENS: IF THE PATTERN OF ROAD  
CLOSURES AND DEMONSTRATIONS CONTINUES,  
TRAVELLERS TO, FROM AND IN NORTHERN IRELAND MAY  
FACE SOME DISRUPTION. WE RECOMMEND THEY STAY IN  
TOUCH WITH THE CONSULATE OR CALL A POLICE TRAVEL-  
LINE WHICH PROVIDES UP TO DATE INFORMATION. THAT

SUBJECT: VIOLENCE CONTINUES ON THE STREETS OF NORTHERN

IRELAND AS THE DRUMCREE STAND-OFF ENTERS THE FOURTH DAY

REF: BELFAST 168 AND PREVIOUS

1. SUMMARY: INTERMITTENT STREET VIOLENCE ERUPTED IN MANY LOYALIST AREAS OF NORTHERN IRELAND FOR THE THIRD SUCCESSIVE NIGHT AS THE "SIEGE OF DRUMCREE" CONTINUES. UNIONIST AND ORANGE ORDER LEADERS MET THE PRIME MINISTER ON JULY 9. ULSTER UNIONIST LEADER DAVID TRIMBLE HAS SUGGESTED A MEETING WITH CHURCH LEADERS, INCLUDING THE CATHOLIC PRIMATE, CATHAL DALY, IN AN EFFORT TO RESOLVE THE SITUATION. THERE ARE HINTS THAT A COMPROMISE ALLOWING ORANGEMEN TO MARCH IN DRUMCREE UNDER CONDITIONS SIMILAR TO LAST YEAR, ALONG WITH A NEW COMMISSION TO DEAL WITH FUTURE PARADES, MIGHT BE IN THE WORKS. HOWEVER, THE "THUG" ELEMENT IN THE NIGHTLY STREET VIOLENCE IS BECOMING INCREASINGLY BRAZEN AS POLICE RESOURCES ARE STRETCHED. WITHOUT SOME RESOLUTION IN DRUMCREE BEFORE THURSDAY EVENING, THE SPIRAL OF VIOLENCE WILL REACH VERY DANGEROUS LEVELS.  
END SUMMARY.

2. THERE WAS SPORADIC STREET VIOLENCE FOR THE THIRD SUCCESSIVE NIGHT IN MANY LOYALIST AREAS OF NORTHERN IRELAND. IN BELFAST, OVER 2,000 ORANGEMEN TOOK PART IN A MARCH THROUGH THE CITY CENTER WHICH BECAME VIOLENT AS POLICE BLOCKED THE MARCHERS' PROPOSED ROUTE TOWARDS THE GROSVENOR ROAD. GANGS OF YOUTHS PELTED POLICE WITH STONES AND BOTTLES. THERE WAS TROUBLE IN NORTH BELFAST, WITH A FACTORY SET ALIGHT IN THE LIGONIEL AREA AND REPORTS OF GUNFIRE NEAR THE NATIONALIST ARDOYNE ENCLAVE. SEVERAL CATHOLIC FAMILIES LIVING IN THE NEWINGTON AREA OF NORTH BELFAST LEFT THEIR HOMES IN HASTE CLAIMING THEY HAD BEEN INTIMIDATED BY LOYALISTS. IN PROTESTANT EAST BELFAST A CAR SHOWROOM WAS DAMAGED BY FIRE AND CARS WERE SET ALIGHT. ONE OF THE MAIN ROUTES INTO THE CENTER OF THE CITY FROM THE EAST - THE NEWTOWNARDS ROAD - WAS STILL CLOSED DURING THE MORNING RUSH-HOUR ON JULY 10. POLICE FIRED PLASTIC BULLETS IN RICHHILL, COUNTY ARMAGH AFTER BEING ATTACKED BY A CROWD WHEN THEY ATTEMPTED TO CLEAR THE ARMAGH TO PORTADOWN ROAD WHICH HAD BEEN BLOCKED BY PROTESTORS. IN DERRY CITY, A CROWD OF ORANGEMEN, LED BY THE CITY'S UNIONIST MAYOR, BLOCKED THE CRAIGAVON BRIDGE FOR A TIME.

3. TROUBLE ALSO FLARED BRIEFLY AT DRUMCREE DURING THE EVENING OF JULY 9, WHERE THE NUMBERS OF ORANGEMEN WERE SWELLED BY THOUSANDS OF SUPPORTERS. AROUND 9 P.M. A CROWD OF ORANGEMEN MOVED INTO A FIELD AND MANAGED TO BREACH THE BARBED WIRE FENCING IN PLACES. THE CROWD EVENTUALLY DISPERSED AFTER POLICE FIRED POLICE FIRED PLASTIC BULLETS. SEVERAL ARRESTS WERE MADE.

4. UNIONIST LEADERS DAVID TRIMBLE, IAN PAISLEY AND ROBERT MCCARTNEY MET PRIME MINISTER MAJOR TO TRY TO PERSUADE HIM TO REVERSE THE CHIEF CONSTABLE'S DECISION TO BAN THE DRUMCREE PARADE. MAJOR INSISTED HOWEVER, THAT HE FULLY SUPPORTED THE DECISION. TRIMBLE SAID AFTER THE MEETING THAT IT WAS "ESSENTIAL" THAT A WAY FORWARD WAS FOUND IN THE NEXT 48 HOURS. HE CONTINUED, "THE PROBLEM IS HOW TO FIND A WAY FORWARD WHEN AT PRESENT THERE ISN'T ANYONE IN THE NATIONALIST AREA TO DEAL WITH. ..WHAT WE HAVE TO DO IS FIND SOMEONE ON THE NATIONALIST SIDE WE CAN TALK TO." TRIMBLE SAID HE WOULD BE HAPPY TO MEET WITH THE LEADERS OF THE FOUR MAIN CHURCHES, INCLUDING CARDINAL CATHAL DALY " TO SEE IF WE CAN FIND A WAY FORWARD IN THIS." PAISLEY VOICED HIS FEAR THAT IF THE SITUATION AT DRUMCREE WAS NOT RESOLVED BEFORE THE TWELFTH OF JULY (THE DAY WHEN ORANGEMEN COMMEMORATE THE 1690 VICTORY OF PRINCE WILLIAM OF ORANGE OVER KING JAMES OF ENGLAND, AND THE MOST IMPORTANT DAY OF THE ORANGE CALENDAR), THAT TENS OF THOUSANDS OF ORANGEMEN WOULD CONVERGE ON DRUMCREE AFTER THEIR OWN PARADES END AND THAT THE CONSEQUENCES COULD BE DISASTROUS.

5. THE LEAD ARTICLE IN THE PRO-UNIONIST "NEWSLETTER" OF JULY 10 POINTED OUT THAT BRENDAN MCKENNA, THE SPOKESMAN FOR THE GARVAGHY ROAD RESIDENTS ASSOCIATION, THE NATIONALIST RESIDENTS OPPOSED TO THE MARCH, WAS

CONVICTED AND JAILED FOR HIS PART IN THE IRA BOMBING OF

THE ROYAL BRITISH LEGION CLUB AT PORTADOWN 15 YEARS AGO.  
THE INVOLVEMENT OF SINN FEIN AND IRA MEMBERS LIKE  
MCKENNA AND GERRY KELLY, A LEADING SINN FEIN MEMBER  
WHO WAS ARRESTED DURING A PROTEST AGAINST AN ORANGE  
MARCH SOME WEEKS AGO, UNDERLINES UNIONIST SUSPICIONS  
THAT THESE PROTESTS ARE MANIPULATED BY REPUBLICANS FOR  
THEIR OWN ENDS. THE PAPER CALLED FOR MODERATE  
NATIONALISTS TO "REACH OUT ...AND WORK OUT SOME FORM OF  
COMMONSENSE AGREEMENT" WITH THEIR UNIONIST NEIGHBORS.

6. SPECULATION THAT THE LOYALIST CEASE-FIRE HAS COLLAPSED  
CONTINUES BUT SOURCES CLOSE TO THE LOYALIST  
PARAMILITARIES INSIST THAT, WHILE THE CEASE-FIRE IS UNDER  
PRESSURE, IT REMAINS INTACT. GARY MCMICHAEL OF THE  
ULSTER DEMOCRATIC PARTY STRENUOUSLY DENIED THAT EITHER  
THE ULSTER DEFENSE ASSOCIATION OR THE ULSTER FREEDOM  
FIGHTERS WERE RESPONSIBLE. "I CAN SPEAK CONFIDENTLY AND  
SAY THAT THEY WERE NOT INVOLVED IN THIS MURDER," HE SAID.  
MCMICHAEL HAD ORIGINALLY SAID THAT HIS PARTY WOULD  
CONTINUE TO ATTEND THE TALKS, BUT HAS NOW JOINED WITH  
OTHER UNIONIST PARTIES IN NOT PARTICIPATING IN THE  
STORMONT TALKS UNTIL THE DRUMCREE ISSUE IS RESOLVED. IN  
DISCUSSIONS WITH CONOFF MCMICHAEL SAID THAT THERE WAS A  
LARGE DEGREE OF OPPORTUNISM AT WORK WITH TEENAGE  
GANGS GROWING PROGRESSIVELY MORE CONFIDENT EVERY  
NIGHT. HE SAID THEY WERE UNCONTROLLABLE AND DID NOT  
ANSWER TO ANY AUTHORITY FIGURES.

7. (SBU) CONSUL GENERAL VISITED PORTADOWN JULY 10 AND  
MET WITH THE RUC DIVISION COMMANDER THERE. ALTHOUGH  
THE SCENE WAS QUIET AT THE DRUMCREE SITE WHERE  
ORANGEMEN ARE CONFRONTING THE RUC, THE PROTESTERS HAD  
BROUGHT IN A BULLDOZER AND PLACED IT ON POLICE LINES.  
AFTER THE POLICE PRODUCED THEIR OWN (LARGER) BULLDOZER  
AND NEGOTIATIONS ENSUED, THE ORANGE LEADERS MOVED  
THEIR BULLDOZER TO A LOCATION BEHIND THE CHURCH. POLICE  
AND OTHER SOURCES ARE HOPEFUL THAT A COMPROMISE CAN BE  
BROKERED BEFORE THE EVENING OF JULY 11, BUT WARN THAT IF  
THE STANDOFF AT DRUMCREE CONTINUES, POLICE AND MILITARY  
RESOURCES WILL BE SERIOUSLY STRETCHED. OUR SOURCES  
BLAME INTERNAL DISSENT WITHIN THE ULSTER DEFENSE FORCE  
(UVF) FOR FUELING THE VIOLENCE OF THE PAST FEW DAYS,  
NOTING THAT LOYALIST POLITICAL LEADERS LIKE DAVID ERVINE

HAVE LOST INFLUENCE IN MID-ULSTER OVER THE PAST YEAR.
