

Dear Mr. President:

I want to congratulate you on your courage in granting Mr. Gerry Adams, President of Sinn Fein, permission to make his current two week visit to the United States. I know you did so in the face of considerable pressure not to allow it, both from the British government, and from our own State department. From all media accounts, he seems to be having some success in mollifying some hard line American/Irish Republicans.

I urge you, and hope that Senators Mikulski, Sarbanes and Representative Cardin will join me in urging you to meet with Mr. Adams personally or to arrange for high level State Department officials to meet with him during his visit to Washington this week.

I had the pleasure of meeting Mr. Adams socially when I was in West Belfast in August, just prior to the announcement of the I.R.A.'s unilateral cease fire. (The attached news article is self-explanatory in regard to the purpose of my visit.) The argument that for you to meet with him would be condoning his alleged role in the paramilitary violence of the past twenty five (25) years is ludicrous. Certainly, your meeting with Prime Minister Major is not condoning Britain's history under successive governments of conquest, colonialism and cruelty to the Irish people (Catholic and Protestant). The British claim to be peacekeepers, but the cruelty continues.

I saw repeated acts on the part of British troops that I consider of the utmost cruelty. They routinely stick the muzzle end of their semi-automatic rifles in the faces of the young children (4,5,6 and 7, year olds) of West Belfast and sometimes utter the words, "I am going to kill you."

As a professional social worker and former child welfare worker, I know that such acts constitute the severest form of psychological cruelty, and make it easier to understand why adult Irishmen think it morally acceptable to kill British soldiers.


My witnessing these acts, and my extensive reading of Irish/British history to the current moment have convinced me that peace will never come to that beautiful but blighted land unless two conditions are met:

1. Sinn Fein must be at the negotiating table.
2. British troops must be out of Ireland.

Please, Mr. President, meet with Mr. Adams and continue your efforts to push the peace process in a positive direction.

American delegation pledges to back 'human rights battle'

The leader of an American fact-finding mission in Belfast over the past seven days has pledged to lobby support for the MacBride Principles on fair employment when his group returns to the US.

And Kevin Danaher of the San Francisco-based Global Exchange - a group which promotes development links between the US and Third World communities - says ordinary Americans are ill-informed about the situation in Northern Ireland.

"It would really blow their minds if they could see this place," he said. "Not only the massive army presence on the streets but also the incredible community festivals which we have witnessed. The only thing America has which can compare to these massive celebrations is Woodstock. Until now, we have concentrated on developing links with embattled Third World countries such as Cuba, Haiti and South Africa but we now want to set a precedent by encouraging joint initiatives with communities in Northern Ireland."

Mr Danaher, an author and full-time worker with

Global Exchange, says the 14 participants in the Irish trip are all professionals who have a long record of backing grassroots' projects in Latin America and Africa. "We see our role as educating Americans about the way our country, as the number one power in the world, intervenes in the affairs of other countries," he explained. "In doing so, we try to show how America is actually taking wealth out of Third World countries when any decent American would agree they should be putting wealth into these places."

The Global Exchange co-founder said that on its return his group would be discussing ways in which it could bring influence to bear on the British Government. "Most Americans accept the British claim that this is a problem of warring tribes but having been here we don't swallow this Catholic-Protestant thing. That's the definition of the guy on top but to us the problem has

its roots in Britain's presence and the creation of a settler group."

During their visit to Ireland, the Global Exchange delegates toured South Armagh, Derry and visited communities on both sides of the Belfast peaceline. The group also met with civil liberties groups and justice campaigners.

"We made many contacts with groups such as the Anti-Strip Search Committee, the Plastic Bullets Committee and the Cullyhanna Justice Group, which we hope to develop on our return," he said. "Global Exchange has contacts with every solidarity campaign in the States and now, for the first time, we want to let

groups working with the people of Cuba, or Honduras, or Vietnam or South Africa, that there is a struggle for human rights going on in Northern Ireland also. And we want to foster solidarity links with those human rights campaigners in Ireland so that we can increase awareness of their fight. That will, of course, mean

support for the MacBride Principles campaign but our members will be looking at other ways they can help, whether by raising money or organising further visits. Ultimately," he added, "all politics is a bumper sticker, 'Unite Friends, Divide Enemies'." The Global Exchange group returned to the US on Tuesday.

I would like to take this opportunity to recommend his continued contractual appointment. If you have any questions, or would like to discuss this further, please do not hesitate to contact me.



Dear Editor:

Our President is taking a real beating, and a spirit of meanness pervades the land. Conventional wisdom says he is failing on all fronts. Senators Dole, Gramm, D'Amato and company, rarely have solutions to offer, just criticize; Limbaugh and his ilk, the carping cohort of criticism (to rework a Safire phrase), distort facts and make false accusations and then cheer as the President's stock goes down.

We have a President who makes mistakes, but they are the mistakes of someone who is trying to achieve something. President Clinton has initiated more programs to help the middle class and the poor, the disenfranchised and needy than any president since Truman. His leadership created such achievements as parent leave, youth corps, NAFTA, and an anti-crime bill, plus dramatic improvement in the economy. But special interests and the country's "haves" continue to hold sway over anxious to be reelected Congresspersons, thus continuing the tragic pattern established by President Reagan and supported by President Bush.

Health care reform is one example. No members of congress have recommended the superb insurance plan enjoyed by Federal employees including themselves be abolished, but *have* chosen to deny an even lesser health plan to their own constituents, at least to those who have no voting clout or campaign contributions to make. Tragically among them are a large number of Democrats who do not seem to remember what the party should be about — a champion of all the people, not just the privileged few.

Some people say that President Clinton does not have the confidence of the American people. After all, look at the polls. We disagree. The strident voices of hate and fear are unfortunately effective, but not everyone has fallen under their spell. We, therefore, are asking anyone who supports President Clinton in making this nation a caring rather than a fearful and distrusting place to write to the President and tell him so. We also suggest that that same letter be sent to your senators and representatives to remind them that you support the president's initiatives and will not support those who carp and cavil against him and his policies. Further, we hope you will contact friends and ask them to put a letter like this in *their* local newspapers

The nay sayers are organized. They write letters. They influence the polls. Can those of us who believe in what this country can mean for all its people also bestir ourselves enough to do a little to counteract the negativeness that pervades it? A very few people changed the way we think about saving the environment. Can we mobilize those who would make the difference in the direction this country is heading? Can enough people of good will call up the required enthusiasm and energy to support our president? We hope so!
