Thank you for your recent letter and your warm words about my Administration's support of the peace process in Northern Ireland. And thank you for forwarding the card from Mrs. Campbell of County Mayo wishing me good luck on my visit to Ireland.

As you and others who participated in the visit know, the people of Ireland, north and south, used the occasion to demonstrate their unshakable commitment to peace and to peaceful means of achieving a lasting settlement to the conflict in Northern Ireland. That commitment has not flagged, in spite of the deplorable resort to violence by the IRA since February. My Administration will continue to do everything possible to help create the lasting peace the people of Northern Ireland want and deserve.

The setting of June 10 as the date for the beginning of talks on the future of Northern Ireland marks a watershed in the peace process. I have called on the IRA to reinstate its cease-fire immediately to allow Sinn Fein to participate in the talks. There will be an election on May 30 in Northern Ireland for delegates to a forum independent of the talks. I believe the full participation of all parties in all aspects of the process offers the best chance of creating a lasting peace.
