

WHEREAS, the celebration of St. Patrick's Day reminds us that for years Maine citizens and the people of the Republic of Ireland have sought peace in Northern Ireland; and

WHEREAS, Maine citizens are deeply gratified that peace is now possible in Northern Ireland; and

WHEREAS, former United States Senator George Mitchell has played a key role in bringing about peace in Northern Ireland; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That We, the Members of the One Hundred and Nineteenth Legislature, now assembled in the First Regular Session, extend our heartfelt appreciation to the Honorable George Mitchell for his outstanding efforts in helping to establish peace in Northern Ireland; and be it further

RESOLVED: That suitable copies of this resolution, duly authenticated by the Secretary of State, be transmitted to the President of the United States, the Prime Minister of Great Britain and the Taoiseach of the Republic of Ireland.


