Thank you for your letter and kind words for my Administration's support of the Northern Ireland peace process. Since your letter, the terrible IRA bombings in London have dealt a blow to all of us who cherish the prospect of a just and lasting settlement to the conflict. But I believe firmly that we must not allow terrorists to derail the peace process and frustrate the legitimate hopes of the people of Northern Ireland for a normal life for themselves and their children.

I welcomed the announcement by Prime Ministers Major and Bruton of a clear path to all-party talks beginning June 10. Sinn Fein can participate in the process leading to the talks and, once the cease-fire is restored, in the talks themselves.

Gerry Adams has a crucial role to play in getting the cease-fire restored and the peace process back on track. I have therefore decided to renew his visa for three months so that he can maintain contact as necessary with members of the Irish-American community.
